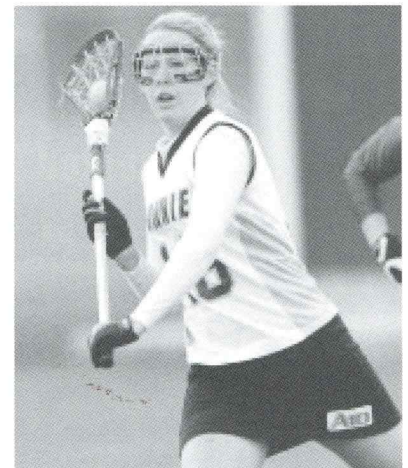
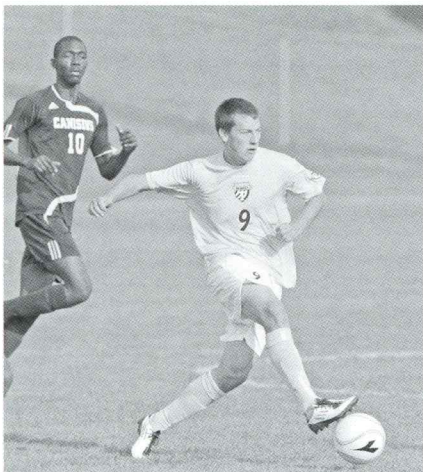

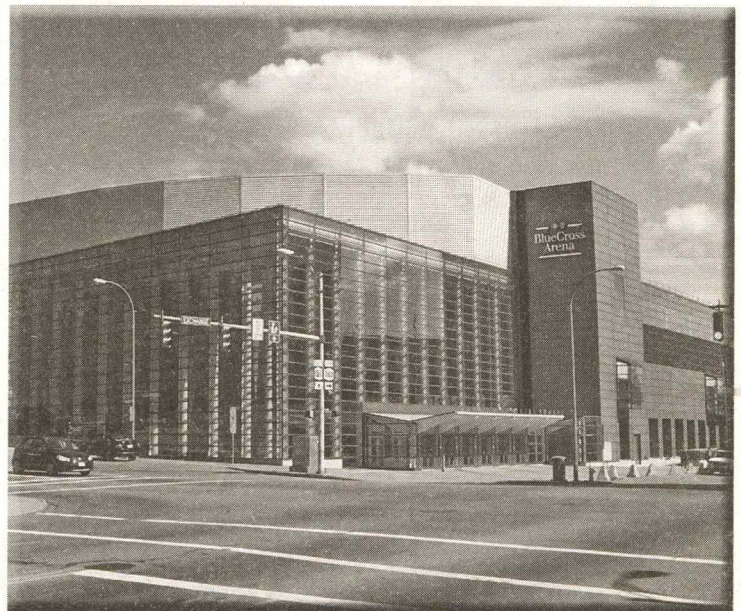
ALL-TIME SERIES

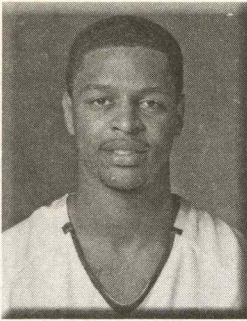
The Rochester-to-St. Bonaventure Connection

Though separated by some 120 miles, St. Bonaventure University and the greater Rochester region have long been coupled. Large numbers of students from the region matriculate south and west to the St. Bonaventure campus each fall. Bonaventure graduates are employed by Rochester companies and many wind up making the Flower City a life-long home.

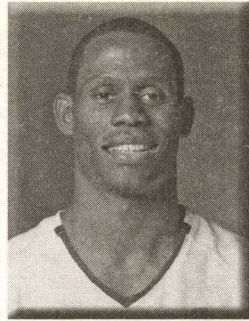
So too coupled are Rochester and St. Bonaventure basketball, which returns tonight to Blue Cross Arena. The encounter with NC State marks the 17th Bona basketball game in Rochester. Last year, the Bonnies took Virginia Tech to overtime before falling 76-68 in a hard-fought game.

There have also been 12 Rochester natives who have played for St. Bonaventure, some of whom will be in the Arena tonight. The name Tyler Relph is prominent since the former McQuaid Jesuit star and New York

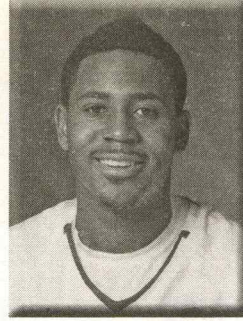
State Player of the Year completed his college career in 2008. Also notable are standout guards Mark Jones and Glenn Hagan and player/coach Larry Weise. Jones ranks ninth on St. Bonaventure's all-time scoring list with 1,704 points and sixth all-time in assists with 408. Hagan, who helped the Bonnies win the NIT championship as a junior in 1977, was St. Bonaventure's career assists record holder when he graduated and now stands third. Hagan also ranks 18th all-time at Bona's with 1,396 points. Weise, who played for the "Brown Indians" from 1956-58, is best known as the coach who led St. Bonaventure to the Final Four in 1970. Weise, who still calls Rochester home (at least when the weather is warm), is St. Bonaventure's winningest coach with 202 victories in 12 seasons.



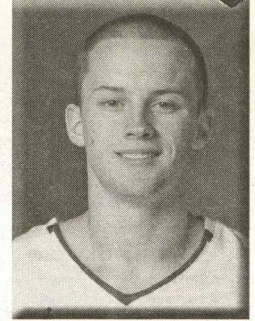

St. Bonaventure's Head Coach



HEAD COACH Mark Schmidt Fifth Season at St. Bonaventure Boston College '85

Biography:

With his blue collar work ethic now installed in the program, fifth-year head coach Mark Schmidt will continue his revival of St. Bonaventure basketball in 2011-12.

Schmidt took over the tradition-rich program on April 10, 2007, becoming the 19th head coach in school history.

In just five short years, Schmidt and the Bonnies have re-energized the Bona faithful and basketball-passionate Western New York community.

During the 2010-11 campaign, Schmidt oversaw a Bonnies squad that posted the school's first winning season (16-15) and postseason berth (CBI) since 2001-02. The Bonnies - picked for second to last in the preseason poll - exceeded expectations and finished tied for seventh in the league standings and earned a home A-10 Championship game for the second straight season.

During his third season in 2009-10, Schmidt guided the Bonnies to their second straight season with 15 wins. St. Bonaventure gained its second consecutive berth in the Atlantic 10 Championship, where the Bonnies defeated Duquesne for the program's first postseason win since 2002.

In 2008-09, St. Bonaventure finished with a 15-15 overall record - the program's best mark in the last six years. Included in that season was a program record seven consecutive road wins to start the season and the program's first trip back to the Atlantic 10 Tournament since 2005. Team team's seven true road wins also tied the record set by the 2001-02 club.

Key to the quick turnaround in 2008-09 was the team's ability to buy into Schmidt's emphasis on playing hard for 40 minutes. That philosophy paid big dividends, as the Bonnies out-rebounded 22 of their 30 opponents en route to ranking in the top five in the conference in all three major rebounding statistics. Also a direct result of Schmidt's style of play was the team's 70.8 points per game - the most by a Bonaventure team since 2002-03.

During the 2008-09 season, freshman Andrew Nicholson was named the A-10 Rookie of the Year and a Freshman All-American by CollegeHoopsNet.com. Nicholson is the third player in Schmidt's eight-year head coaching career to win a conference Rookie of the Year accolade. Junior Jonathan Hall also flourished under Schmidt's run-and-gun style, becoming the second player in program history to lead the team in points, rebounds and assists in the same season.

Additionally, Schmidt achieved a personal milestone of his own midway through the season, as he earned his 100th career win in the team's 78-65 win at Fordham in the A-10 opener.

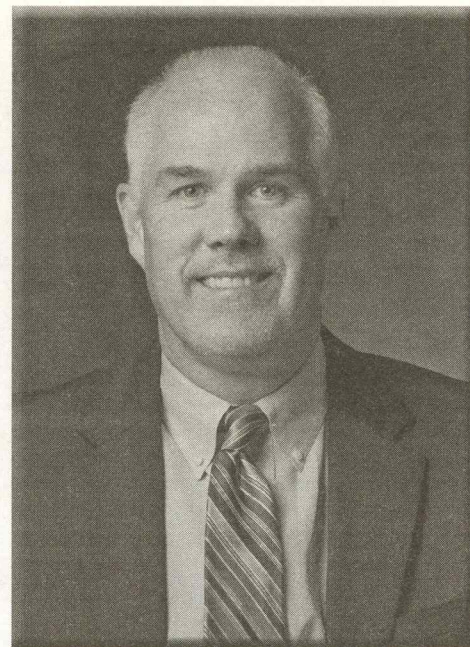
Schmidt's intense personality rubbed off on everyone involved with the program in his first season, as St. Bonaventure was much more competitive in the ultra-talented A-10 Conference. Disguised in the team's 8-22 record were 10 losses by 10 points or less, including four by five points or less.

St. Bonaventure's senior class of Zarryon Fereti, Michael Lee and Tyler Relph flourished under just one season of Schmidt's guidance. All three posted career years on the court and experienced success of the court by graduating in May. Both Fereti and Lee worked their way into the professional ranks overseas, while Relph finished as the NCAA leader in free throw percentage.

Schmidt served as the head coach at Robert Morris for six seasons prior to coming to St. Bonaventure. There, he inherited a program that had managed just a 7-22 record in the season before his arrival. Schmidt quickly turned things around, leading the Colonials to the Northeast Conference Tournament semifinals in 2004 and 2006. During his six seasons at RMU, he had an overall record of 82-90, including a 15-14 mark in 2005-06, the program's first winning season since 2000. Schmidt turned the Colonials into a year-in and year-out contender in the conference, posting a 58-52 mark in league play highlighted by four seasons of 10 or more league wins.

Schmidt coached six NEC All-Conference players at RMU, along with three All-Rookie team selections and one Conference Rookie of the Year in Jeremy Chappell in 2006. Over the last two seasons, Schmidt has seen his former recruits Tony Lee and Chappell garner back-to-back NEC Player of the Year accolades.

Prior to Robert Morris, Schmidt spent seven seasons as an assistant coach at Xavier University under head coach Skip Prosser. Schmidt served as the program's top recruiter, landing future NBA players Torraye Braggs (Houston Rockets), Lionel Chalmers (Minnesota Timberwolves), James Posey (Miami Heat), Romain Sato (San Antonio Spurs) and David West (New Orleans/Oklahoma City Hornets). With most of his coaching responsibilities centered around the post players, Schmidt helped develop West into a three-time Atlantic 10 Player of the Year and the National Player of the Year in 2003.



During his stay in Cincinnati, Ohio, Schmidt helped lead the Musketeers to four NCAA Tournament appearances and the National Invitational Tournament (NIT) twice. Xavier claimed its first-ever Atlantic 10 West Division title in 1996-97 and both the West Division and tournament championships in 1997-98. In 1997, Xavier defeated Vanderbilt in the first round of the NCAA Tournament and finished the season with the school's highest Associated Press ranking at No. 13. The Musketeers made it to the NIT Final Four at Madison Square Garden in 1999, finishing third, the school's best finish since 1958.

Schmidt served as an assistant under Prosser at Loyola College during the 1993-94 season. He helped guide the Greyhounds to the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Tournament title and the school's first-ever NCAA Tournament berth.

From 1991-93, Schmidt was an assistant at Penn State University under Bruce Parkhill. The Nittany Lions went 21-8 in 1992 and appeared in the NIT. Schmidt's coaching career began with a two-year stint as an assistant at St. Michael's College in Vermont.

Schmidt played four seasons at Boston College, where he received his bachelor's degree in business administration and management with a concentration in marketing. In his freshman season under head coach Tom Davis, the Eagles went 22-10 and made the NCAA Elite Eight. Schmidt played his final three years under the guidance of head coach Gary Williams. Boston College advanced to the NIT in 1984 and the NCAA Sweet Sixteen the other two years.

A native of North Attleboro, Mass., Schmidt and his wife Anita have three sons, Nicholas, Derek and Michael.

HEAD COACH Mark Gottfried First Season at NCSU Alabama, '87

Biography:

A veteran of 17 NCAA tournament appearances as both a player and coach, Mark Gottfried was named the 19th men's basketball coach in NC State history on April 5, 2011. Gottfried, 47, is one of America's most respected coaches and brings a wealth of experience and achievement to the Wolfpack position.

"I am extremely excited about this opportunity and challenge," said Gottfried. "I have always had great respect for the tradition of excellence here at NC State and I look forward to helping build this basketball program into a national contender. There is no question in my mind that we can achieve high levels of success here. That leadership combined with our world-class facilities and passionate fan base is a great foundation for building a championship program."

For the past two seasons, Gottfried served as an ESPN basketball analyst, a position that he feels will serve him well as a coach. As an analyst, he had the opportunity to visit numerous schools, observe practice and preparation techniques and styles.

Gottfried spent 10 seasons as head coach at Alabama (1999-09), compiling a record of 210-132 with five NCAA Tournament and three NIT appearances. He led Alabama to three top 25 final rankings, including one top 10 ranking. More importantly, during his last eight years at the head of the program, 29 of 30 seniors graduated on time.

He led the Tide to the SEC regular season championship in his fourth season, also the first of five straight trips to the NCAA Tournament. For his efforts, Gottfried was named the 2002 SEC Coach of the Year.

Gottfried's 2002-03 squad became the first in Alabama history to be ranked No. 1 in the AP poll, as the team held the ranking for two weeks. That season, the Tide broke all previous attendance records.

The program achieved another first during the 2003-04 season, as Alabama upset top-ranked and top-seeded Stanford in the second round of the NCAA Tournament and then defeated reigning national champion Syracuse to advance to the school's first Elite Eight appearance.

"We are blessed to have hired a proven winner and an outstanding coach who is well prepared by experience and total commitment to lead in the rebuilding of Wolfpack men's basketball," said Director of Athletics Deborah A. Yow. "NC State

is committed to having a consistently ranked top 25 program and a successful NCAA postseason program, with student-athletes that are successful on the court and in the classroom. We have taken an important step in that direction with the hiring of Coach Gottfried as our leader of the program."

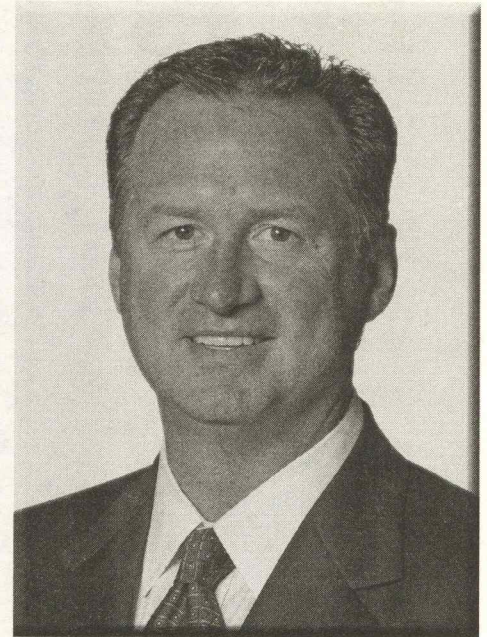
Gottfried was head coach at Murray State for three seasons and earned Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year honors in 1998. He compiled a 68-24 overall record and a 40-12 mark in conference play. In his first season with the Racers, Gottfried's squad advanced to the 1996 NIT, then made the NCAA Tournament in both 1997 and 1998. He coached Murray State to OVC championships in each of his seasons as head coach, becoming the first head coach to win three OVC titles in only three seasons. In his last season, the Racers finished 25th in the final AP poll with a 29-4 record.

Prior to his stint at Murray State, Gottfried spent seven years as an assistant at UCLA (1988-95) and was on the staff when the Bruins won the 1995 national championship. Gottfried coached under Jim Harrick, and was an assistant along with current St. John's head coach Steve Lavin and current Washington head coach Lorenzo Romar.

Gottfried considers himself a players' coach, a description that Mo Williams, who played guard under his tutelage at Alabama from 2002-03 and now plays for the L.A. Clippers, agrees with. "He is a players' coach. He took a personal interest in all of us, both on and off the court," said Williams following Gottfried's hire. "He took us in as family, and put us in a position to succeed. This is a great hire for NC State, they got a great coach and a great recruiter. He has the ability to bring in top talent, and to get players to the next level. He had a great track record at Alabama, and got the most out of all of us."

He started his collegiate playing career at Oral Roberts, where he was a freshman All-American during his one season (1983) with the Golden Eagles.

Gottfried then transferred to Alabama, where he started 98 consecutive games and helped the Crimson Tide advance to the Sweet Sixteen in all three seasons he played. He holds the school record for most three-point field goals in a single game (8), and is the school's all-time leader in three-point field goal percentage (.485).



Gottfried earned a B.S. in communications from Alabama in 1987. He won both the school's Hayden Riley Top Scholar Award and the Bryant Award as the school's top scholar-athlete during his senior year. He was also an academic All-SEC performer.

A seventh-round draft pick of the Detroit Pistons in the 1987 NBA Draft, Gottfried toured internationally with Athletes in Action as a player in 1987-88 and later returned in 1989 to coach a summer tour in Poland and Germany.

The Wolfpack's head coach hails from an athletic background. His father, Joe, retired in 2009 after 28 years as the Director of Athletics at South Alabama. His uncle, Mike Gottfried, was a longtime college football coach and serves as an ESPN college football analyst.

Born January 20, 1964 in Crestline, Ohio, Gottfried is married to the former Elizabeth Kozel. The couple has five children: Brandon (20), Mary Layson (19), Cameron (16), Aaron (15), and Dillon (14). Brandon currently plays tight end for the Stanford football team and Mary Layson will be a freshman in college this year.
