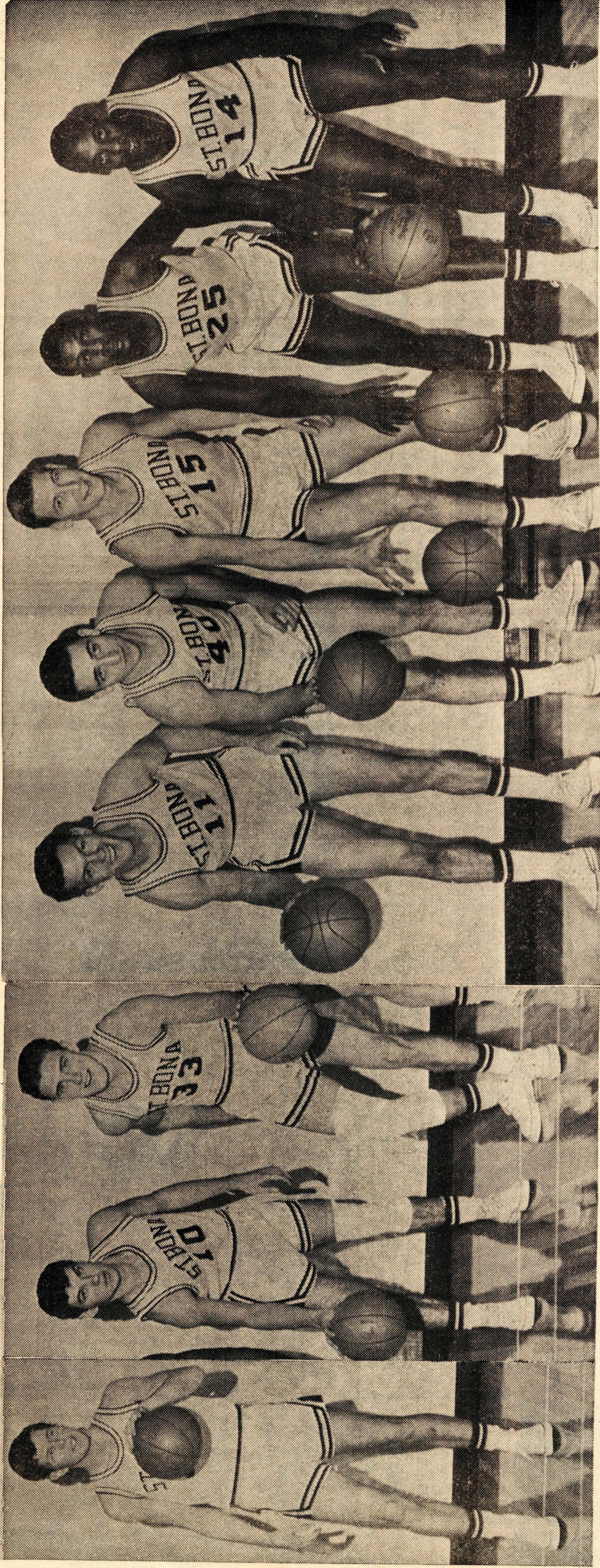

Bona--Bundle Of Question Marks: Quincy Opening Foe Tonight In The New University Center

There are enough question marks hanging over the Bonnies to last the entire basketball season. St. Bonaventure figured to have one of the powerhouses in

the East, but that was in early October. That's no longer true. Now, the Bonnies of coach Larry Weise are one big bundle of question marks. The 1966-67 season opens to-

question marks will go unanswered.

"WE'VE HAD difficulty getting set, getting organized because of the injuries," Weise said today. The misfortunes that hit Bona started in mid-October. Starting with junior backcourt ace Jimmy Satalin. (The news that he couldn't play because of a vascular condition next to the brain). Weise has had a series of news items -- all bad. John Hayes (6-5) and Mike Kull (6-foot), two sophomores who figured to work into the starting lineup early, missed the pre-season drills because of knee injuries. Then Paul Stappenbeck (6 - 8 senior center) jammed his thumb and sustained a hairline fracture and Billy Butler (6-3 junior) re-injured his right shoulder. Both will be

available but Big Stap has to be considered a big disappointment. "We'll use both Hayes and Kull. However, they won't be ready for full time duty for awhile. They've been working lightly this week getting used to operating full court. Naturally we'll be undermanned without a healthy Hayes and Kull. If Billy gets whacked again, he's going to get sore (shoulder)."

Who will we start tonight for the 8:30 (WHDL AM-FM, WESB 8:20 o'clock) tip-off against Quincy? "Butler will be able to play, although the shoulder is still sore," he explained. "We'll have Carter (6-5 senior), Jeff Hazard (6-4 senior) and in

WEISE SAID he was using Hazard instead of Stappenbeck, who started at center last year. "because Jeff has looked good in practice. He's doing a better

backcourt it'll be Ahearn (Eddie, 6-4 junior) and Fran Satalin (5-11 senior)," the coach said.

Sophomore Vinnie Martin (6-3) also will be used in backcourt. He also has a knee injury. Seniors John McLeod (6-1) and Ray Walsh (6-1) round out the squad.

COURT NOTES: Bona Frosh meet Alfred Frosh with game starting at 6:10 o'clock -- Alfred Frosh beat Hobart Frosh, 82-65, last night with Pete Ryan scoring 19 points. Olean High graduate Chris Henzel is on the Alfred club -- Bona Frosh coach, Fred Handler, didn't get to St. Louis last night to scout Quincy. His flight out

of Buffalo was canceled -- St. Louis shot 48.8 per cent to Quincy's 26.6 last night -- Quincy was out-rebounded 66-38, with 7-foot junior Rich Niemann getting 26 points and 20 rebounds. Mike Mathews had 13 points for Quincy.
