This year's Family Weekend at St. Bonaventure University is full of exciting entertainment and amazing talent that is fun for the whole family! So grab a seat, kick up your feet and get ready for a weekend full of innovative performers. The University's 46th Annual Family Weekend, sponsored by the Office of Student Activities, runs Sept. 24-26.

From 8:30 to 11:30 p.m. Friday, Sept. 24, America's No. 1 Party Band, Nik & the Nice Guys, will perform in the Reilly Center Arena. This high-energy band from Rochester features 11 multi-talented musicians and performers, including female singer/dancers and a horn section. Besides playing mainstream rock and roll, the group incorporates Saturday Night Live craziness, encouraging audience participation and dancing. Complimentary hors d'oeuvres and beverages will be served.

If fire and fine china are more to your taste, from 12:30 to 1:30 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 25, check out

the Flying Cat Circus on the Reilly Center Lawn. With the help of razor blades, broken glass, chain saws, strait jackets and mom's fine china, this troupe of talented performers will make your palms sweat and your heart race. But there is no need to worry; there are no flying cats. The rain site will be in Butler Gymnasium.

Saturday evening, at 8:30, the Scrap Arts Music Festival will thunder through the Reilly Center Arena. This Vancouver-based hybrid of STOMP! and the Blue Man Group is a cutting-edge percussion sensation that brings together five athletic and hyper-talented musicians and 25 sculptural instruments into one high-energy, choreographed performance. Percussionist Gregory Kozak created the show from the ground up, fusing pop and world music with 21st century sounds. Discarded sewer pipes, artillery casings and giant steel springs are skillfully crafted into unique, one-of-a-kind instruments for this one-of-a-kind performance.
