



SBU Theater announces 2004-2005 season: Tales 'Ancient, Revolutionary and Shaggy'

St. Bonaventure University's Visual and Performing Arts Department plans to light up the stage with three exciting SBU Theater productions for the 2004-2005 season.

The season opens in November with Mary Zimmerman's "Metamorphoses," a 1999 adaptation of ancient Greek and Roman myths retold for contemporary audiences. Ovid's classic stories are brought vividly to life in a show Time magazine called "a glimpse of the divine."

"Metamorphoses" won four Drama Desk awards and a Tony and SBU Theater's production is a regional premiere.

In March, the SBU Theater season continues with George Bernard Shaw's "The Devil's Disciple," a witty and insightful comedy that takes place during the American Revolution. As romance grows between family "black sheep" Dick Dudgeon and Judith, the minister's wife, the British Army under General Burgoyne arrives. Dudgeon is accused of spying and the general may shorten love's lease — with a noose. This production is presented in conjunction with a Quick Center exhibition of objects and documents from the American Revolution, and marks the return of Shaw to the SBU Theater stage after an absence of many years.

SBU Theater's 2004-2005 season concludes in April with the contemporary comedy "Dog Stories." Ira's faithful dog Sebastian is terminally ill and his dying wish is to go to Disneyland. Their cross-country trek throws them together with a bizarre set of characters who all have "tails" to tell. Critics called the show "an intelligent comedy full of whacked-out hilarious vulgarity." Award-winning Chicago playwright Keith Huff is scheduled to come to the SBU campus to conduct workshops and a "meet the artist" presentation. SBU Theater's production of "Dog Stories" is another regional premiere.

Dr. Ed. Simone, associate professor of theater and director of the theater program at St. Bonaventure, designs and directs the season.

SBU Theater shows run Wednesdays through Saturdays at 7:30 p.m. "Metamorphoses" performs Nov. 10-13, "The Devil's Disciple" runs March 16-19, 2005 and "Dog Stories" will play April 27-30, 2005. "Metamorphoses" and "Dog Stories" are staged in the intimate Garret Theater, and "The Devil's Disciple" in the larger Regis Family Theater. Audiences are advised that "Metamorphoses" contains some adult subject matter and "Dog Stories" contains adult language and subjects.

Tickets are \$8 for the general public and \$6 for subscribers. SBU and Jamestown Community College students can receive complimentary rush seating one hour before each performance with a valid student ID.

Pulitzer Prize-winning alumnus to keynote for SBU's Communications Day

St. Bonaventure University Pulitzer Prize-winning alumnus Brian Toolan will give the keynote address for SBU's Communications Day at 12:30 p.m. Friday, Oct. 22, in Dresser Auditorium of The John J. Murphy Professional Building.

Toolan is a 1972 graduate of St. Bonaventure and now works as the senior vice president of The Hartford Courant, where he is responsible for the direction of a news staff of more than 300 employees. The Courant is Connecticut's largest newspaper.

Toolan and his news staff were awarded the Pulitzer for breaking news coverage of a disgruntled employee's shooting of four supervisors at a Connecticut Lottery headquarters in 1999. At the time, Toolan said the coverage was a combination of deep reporting and dramatic storytelling.

With a degree in English, Toolan started his journalism career as an obituary writer and police reporter at The Scranton Tribune. He then worked as a layout and copy editor for The Dayton Journal Herald, assistant sports editor at the Baltimore News-American and managing editor of The Philadelphia Daily News before joining The Courant in 1998.

"Brian's achievements typify the ethical standards we preach every day in the classroom," said Lee Coppola, dean of the University's Russell J. Jandoli School of Journalism and Mass Communication. "Even though Brian was an English major, he took journalism courses and participated in the undergraduate journalism opportunities that have led to so many successful careers for Bona graduates," he added.

The theme of this year's Communications Day is "Why Journalism Ethics is Important." Communications Day introduces high school students and teachers involved in newspapers, literary magazines, yearbooks and radio and television shows to media professionals. The professional participants hold sessions ranging from sports to public relations to interviews and photojournalism.

Some of this year's workshops include the importance of ethics, using graphics, planning and conducting interviews and writing interesting features and effective opinion pieces. These workshops and many others will start at 9:30 a.m. and end at 11:20 a.m. in the John J. Murphy Professional Building.
