Dr. Livingston Alexander, president of the University of Pittsburgh at Bradford, will discuss the Montgomery Bus Boycott and the key roles played by Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and Rosa Parks as part of the Martin Luther King Week celebration on the St. Bonaventure University campus.

The public is invited to Alexander's talk, slated for 7 p.m. today in the Rigas Family Theater of The Regina A. Quick Center for the Arts.

Before assuming the Pitt-Bradford presidency in August 2003, Alexander was the provost and vice president for academic affairs and professor of psychology at Kean University in Union, N.J.

During the last 12 years, he has been a frequent presenter of seminars and training workshops at colleges, universities, national conferences and professional associations throughout the country on leadership and diversity.

The Harlem Globetrotters, who are performing at St. Bonaventure University at 7 p.m. Monday, Feb. 7, in the Reilly Center Arena, are helping to raise money for the tsuna-

mi victims in Asia by donating proceeds from the sale of their 2005 commemorative game program.

Two dollars will be donated for the sale of each program and The Globetrotters will match the funds raised through the sale of the game programs. Fans wanting to

make additional donations will find collection drums next to merchandise stands.

"This effort to support tsunami relief follows in the Harlem Globetrotters tradition of helping others," said Steve Plesac, director of the Office of Student Activities at SBU. The Globetrotters are not only famous for their talent, but also for the



work they do in an attempt to give back to communities around the country. They have donated more than \$11 million since 1993 to organizations that include the Celebrity First Night Foundation, the Women's Missionary Society, the Life Development Foundation and the American Red Cross.
