

## **‘Shutterbabe’ author, war photograprer to speak at SBU**

**I**n celebration of Women’s History Month at St. Bonaventure University, best-selling author, award-winning photographer and journalist Deborah Copaken Kogan will speak on her nationally bestselling book,

“Shutterbabe: Adventures in Love and War,” at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday, March 8, in Dresser Auditorium of The John J. Murphy Professional Building.

“Shutterbabe:

Adventures in Love and War” is the candid and often witty story of the young Kogan and the battles she faced both in her career and personal life. Her book aims to convey the messages that “war should not be entered into lightly; there can be no hope of universal peace without universal equality for women; what our children learn today will affect and shape our world tomorrow.”

“It’s a privilege to have such an accomplished author, photographer and journalist speak at St. Bonaventure in celebration of Women’s History Month,” said Steve Plesac, director of student activities. “At a school that prides itself on its award-winning journalism department, Deborah Copaken Kogan will not only entertain, but educate both faculty and students alike.”

“Shutterbabe,” published in 2001 by Random House, is soon to be a major motion picture adapted by Dreamworks and Darren

Star, creator of HBO’s hit series, “Sex and the City.”

Fresh out of Harvard University, Kogan moved to Paris at the age of 22 in search of her first photojournalism assignment. Within weeks she was on a truck in Afghanistan in a convoy of what was then called rebel “freedom fighters.” Kogan was the lone woman on that truck armed only with her camera equipment in what was the beginning of a career in which she’s covered

wars, traveled across the globe and witnessed the collapse of the Twin Towers.

Graduating from college in 1988, Kogan worked as a photojournalist until 1992. Her work has graced the pages of “Time,” “Newsweek,” “The New York Times,” “L’Express,” “Liberation” and “Geo,” among many other newspapers and magazines.

The next six years of her life were spent working in TV journalism, most recently as a producer for “Dateline NBC.” Along with her photographs, her writing has also appeared in many magazines, including the “New York Times Magazine” and “O, The Oprah Magazine.”

Aside from her published work, Kogan has also been invited as a guest on such shows as “The Today Show,” “CNN” and “NPR.” She has been the topic of feature stories in “The New York Times,” Entertainment Weekly,” “Glamour,” “British Elle” and “Paris Match.”

Kogan has also performed as a storyteller with The Moth on New York City stages and has given readings throughout the country with theater groups. She has lectured at universities throughout the country including Harvard, The Columbia Journalism School and NYU.
