

ESPN'S Pat Forde, WGR'S Howard Simon and Bona alums headline SBU'S Joyce Symposium

SPN.com senior writer Pat Forde, WGR Radio host Howard Simon and two St. Bonaventure graduates — Jeff D'Alessio '91, the college sports editor of the Atlanta Journal-Constitution, and Justin Craig, '95, a producer at ESPN Radio — will headline the 2005 Dick Joyce Sports Symposium at 2 p.m. Monday, April 18, in Dresser Auditorium of St. Bonaventure's John J. Murphy Professional Building.

The University's Russell J. Jandoli School of Journalism and Mass Communication will host the biannual event, which again will feature a myriad of local and regional sports journalists and professionals in addition to the main panel.

The theme of this year's symposium, which is free and open to the public, is "Separating Sports Reporting from Opinion." Throughout the symposium, Forde, Simon, D'Alessio and Craig will address the theme, but the goal of the symposium is to stimulate an open discussion of this and other relevant topics. All panelists and attendees will be available for interviews following the symposium.

The symposium is named in honor of Dick Joyce, '60, a former sportswriter for The Associated Press who died in 1988 at 53. In addition to The Associated Press, Joyce worked for United Press International, NBC and the New York World-Telegram & Sun. While at St. Bonaventure, Joyce spent three semesters as sports editor and one year as news editor for The Bona Venture.

The Jandoli School also honors graduate John A. Domino, '84, with the symposium. The John Domino Award is presented at each symposium to a professional in the field of sports journalism and communication. Domino, a former ESPN and Empire Sports Network staff member, died after battling cancer. Past recipients of the Domino Award include Van Miller of WIVB-TV, Dick Vitale of ESPN, Terry Taylor of The Associated Press and Paul Maguire of ESPN.

The 2005 recipient of the John Domino Award will be 1976 St. Bonaventure graduate Jim Marchiony. A veteran collegiate athletics administrator, Marchiony is in his second year as associate athletics director for external relations at the University of Kansas.

Prior to joining Kansas, Marchiony worked at the University of Connecticut, where he served as associate athletics director for approximately two years. Before UConn, Marchiony spent 17 years with the NCAA, serving the last five years as media coordinator for the NCAA Division I men's basketball tournament. A former student-athlete himself in the sport of tennis, Marchiony was inducted into St. Bonaventure's Athletics Hall of Fame in 1991.
