I. All enlisted men of this Command, will be at once furnished with company letters and numbers for their caps. Commanding Officers will make the necessary requisitions without delay. After having been so supplied, it will be considered a suspicious circumstance justifying the arrest and detention of any man to be found without such letters and figures. No other ornaments than those admitted by the Regulations will be worn by any enlisted man.

II. No more than ten enlisted men of any one regiment, will be granted passes to leave camp on the same day, and, except in extraordinary cases, all such passes will expire at retreat. Men not on duty found away from their camps without such passes, will be subject to arrest by the Provost Guard.
