for duty & we expect a lot of
Conscripts in a few days. I wish
we had a lot of those Cappieheads
down here. We would put them
in the front & form a strong
rear guard up there behind them
and we would show them what
a fine thing a "scat" was. (I mean)
Dont you think they would
come to terms?

They are falling in for
Roll call & I shall have to stop
writing and go and answer to
my man. and I will finish
this in the morning if a few
time before I go on picket

Camp of the 94th N.Y.S. Inf
Rappanack Station Aug. 23rd 1863
My Dear Sarah

I received your letter
a week ago yesterday but have
not had time to answer it so
hope you will not think that
I have forgotten you by not
writing before I was on picket
three days but work and ha-
ve days rest and then went
on Camp guard and came off yester-
day morning and I expect
to go on picket again tomorrow
Sat. I would like to write
you a good long letter and tell
you all the particulars. But I have

no time this evening. I don't get
as much time to write now as
I did when I was in the Hospital.
I was very very glad to get your
letters. But it went a good ways
around before it got to me.
It came to the Start & then to the
Distribution Camp & from there to
the Regiment. But your letters
are all bound to find me. I
guess there has not an failed
to reach me. Which I don't get
more than half that my folks
write me. I can't tell the reason
of that. We have been here
ever since I came to the Regt.
I got here the 8th of Aug. But
no one can tell how long we
shall stay here. Late some
years ago to day our Regt
left this place after laying here

for three days under the ~~the~~ ~~the~~
garrison of the ~~the~~ ~~the~~ ~~the~~ ~~the~~ ~~the~~ ~~the~~
garrison. But little did I think at
all what has transpired inside of
that year, as little did I expect
it. I wonder where I will be a year
from to day. Will I be here do you
think? I hope not. Late, I was
realy glad to get back to th. Co.
again th. Boys was all so glad to
see me. and asked man questions
about what was going on at
home than I could answer in a
week. they seemed to think that
I had just come from home.
There was a good many Yankees
Boys like prisoners at Gettysburg
but the most of them are south
now. they were paralled on the
field and the Government would
not recognize them as paralled
