Sept. 12th 1863

Father

I sent a letter yesterday
to Mary with 10 dollars in
it I sent it because I did
not know where I could
get a chance to send any
by Express. But I gave
the Lieut. 100 dollars this
morning he said he would
get it expressed for me
for I am on guard to
day & could not go to
the express office. & I did
not want to keep so much
money around a great
while for fear I might
get relieved of it.
