did when I went home. my tooth ache so that I cannot hardly tell what I am writing and if there is no sense in this letter you must lay it to that I got me a verry good pair of pants made a[t] Jamestown and they fit nice. I found a letter here from you and one from Pa and Ma and one from Saphronia when I came back but got none from Joe or Philander, and now I must close and get to bed so that my teeth will stop aching Oh I wish you to send me some postage stamps as I forgot to buy any and now good night and may God keep us from Sin and harm is the prayr of your Affectionate Husband and Father
