

- Outline of my military history -

Enrolled Aug 28, 1862, at Randolph NY <sup>as private</sup>  
Mustered in with Regiment Sept 26, 1862 at Janestown NY <sup>in Co H, 187, N Y Vol</sup>  
Promoted to first Sergeant April 1863. by Capt J Nelson  
Wounded and prisoner at Chancellorsville May 2, 1863  
~~May 13, 1863 - and reported killed -~~  
Paroled and taken to Brooks Station Va, May 13, 1863  
and placed in Division Hospital - (Camps then at Prosser Sta)  
Remained to Chestnut Hill Genl Hospital Phila in June  
Promoted to 2<sup>d</sup> Lieut. by Com<sup>d</sup> of Gov. Seymour, dated June 11/63  
Discharged from hospital Sept 17, 1863, and sent to Parol Camp  
at Alexandria Va  
Oct 16, Exchange reported, and sent to Regiment then at  
Bridgport Ala, via B & O Ry  
Reached Bridgport late in Oct<sup>r</sup> and  
at once assigned to duty as Actg Adjutant  
Dec<sup>r</sup> 29. Mustered in as 2<sup>d</sup> Lieut. to date from  
July 6, 1863 - Served as adjutant - and also  
H<sup>q</sup> sergeant until about May 4, 1864  
May 4, 1864 - Assigned to Co. D, and put in command  
& continued in command until end of the war  
also commended Co. E. for several months in the  
Allentown Campaign -  
Commissioned Captain by Gov Fenton date of Com<sup>d</sup>.  
Mustered in as Captain at Allentown Oct 16, 1864, and  
continued in command of Co. D -  
At Saratoga Co., N.Y. 1864, in an election held by  
order of Col. Pitt Jones, by the officers of the Regiment  
was elected Mayor - When Col Jones forwarded recommenda-  
tion accordingly to Gov Fenton <sup>1865</sup>  
At Goldsboro North Carolina April 14, (about) received  
commission as Major in first mail received after

Leaving Savannah - Date of commission March 4, 1863  
In grand review at Washington May 28, 1863  
Mustered out with regiment at Bladenburg Md  
June 11, 1863 -  
Finally discharged with regiment when disbanded  
at Elmira N.Y. June 23, 1863 -  
Reached home at Westburg Chaut. C. N.Y.  
June 1863 -

Memorandum -

Our regiment was first assigned to duty under  
Gen. Sigel, at Stafford Fairfax Co. - and then became  
a part of the 1st Brigade 2<sup>d</sup> Div. 11. Army Corps -  
and so continued until the consolidation of 11 & 12 Corps  
at or about Chattanooga, in the Spring of 1864 -  
then placed in 2<sup>d</sup> brigade 2<sup>d</sup> Div. 20<sup>th</sup> Army Corps -  
and continued in that brigade to the close of the war

I was in every engagement that the regiment participated  
in except the battle of Gettysburg - was then in hospital  
from wound at Chancellorsville

The Regiment marched with the brigade with a force commanded by Gen Gordon to the relief of Knoxville immediately from the Missionary Ridge battle field. It was also in the march from Atlanta to the sea - and from Savannah through the Carolinas to Raleigh - and from Raleigh after Gen Lee's surrender through Virginia to Washington - and was in the ground again - I was with the regiment every day for service from muster in Sept 26. 62 to discharge Jan 23, 1865. Except the time I was in hospital disabled from the Chancellorsville wound - was home on furlough for 15 days only when so convalescing from wounds in hospital -

While at Atlanta served on division court martial as junior officer - Also served on division court martial at Savannah -

I was never promoted in as major the regiment being below the minimum and having two field officers - Besides the war ended soon after my commission was received -

At the close of the war I was given a commission by Gen Fenton of N.Y. as in & brevet Lieut Colonel -

First and only application for pension filed July 19, 1907, under 9th statute. Denied Pension here, when I made the application
