

ANDREW AND FANNIE FOX BLOOD FAMILY RECORD.

Andrew Blood and Fannie Fox (born March 12, 1845) were married in November 1865 and came to Coldspring township and lived in a chapel that was located then on the upper Bunker Hill road. The chapel was later moved to the Isaiah Darling farm on the Lebanon Road and remodeled for a home (present DeForrest Carr home). Mr. Blood built the large house on Lebanon road a short distance south and on the opposite side of the highway from the chapel remodeled home, about 1888, in which Mr. and Mrs. Blood raised their family and where Mr. Blood died Oct. 11, 1910 and Mrs. Blood on May 28, 1928. Both are buried in Steamburg cemetery.

Their first child, Fred, drowned in a pond near the home when about 2 years old. Clyde born Dec. 14, 1867 married Anna Potter and resided in Jamestown. Both are deceased.

Elva, born June 10, 1870, married the Rev. Seth G. Bartlett of Michigan, in 1893 and resided in Michigan until 1906 when they came to Coldspring township and bought the farm on Lebanon road (the house and small acreage on west side of the highway now owned by Mrs. Harry Jeffers; the barn and farm land on east side of highway now owned by William Lockwood) where they lived until after Mrs. Blood's death in 1928 when they bought the home place where Mrs. Bartlett was born and where she still lives. Rev. Bartlett died Dec. 29, 1937 and is buried in Steamburg cemetery. Rev. and Mrs. Bartlett had three children: Leigh who married Stella Parkins, lived here a number of years and their children, Betty and Donald were born here, also, an infant son who died Dec. 27, 1926. Mr. and Mrs. Leigh Bartlett reside in Cattaraugus now. Paul Bartlett married Pearl Gates, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Lyle Gates, residents of Coldspring then, June 12, 1930 and live in Salamanca. They have two sons, David and James. Marjorie Bartlett married Dr. Ellwyn Heier, son of Mr. and Mrs. L.H. Heier of Steamburg, Dec. 10, 1932 and reside in Cattaraugus where Dr. Heier has a large practice.

Nell Blood married Gus Lundquist and resided in Jamestown and Oil City, Pa. Both deceased.

Lee Blood married Edith Foy (Bunker Hill road) and resided in Jamestown. Mrs. Blood deceased.
