DECLARATION FOR INVALID PENSION.
Acts of June 27, 1890, and May 9, 1900.

To be executed before some officer authorized to administer oaths for general purposes. The official character and signature of any such officer not required by law to use a seal must be certified by the clerk of the proper court, giving dates of beginning and close of official term. If certificate on file, so state.

STATE OF New York, County of Cattaraugus, SS:

On this 10th day of September, A. D. one thousand nine hundred (1900) personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace within and for the County and State aforesaid, Frederick Bollow, aged 58 years, a resident of the town of Ellicottville, County of Cattaraugus, State of New York, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical Frederick Bollow who was ENROLLED on the 21" day of July, 1862, in Co. B, 154" Regt. New York Vol. Inf. in the service of the United States in the War of the Rebellion, and served at least Ninety Days, and was HONORABLY DISCHARGED at Convalesent Camp, Va., on the 17 day of January, 1863. That he is wholly unable to earn a support by manual labor by reason of dyspepsia, piles, heart disease, hernia of right groin, slight deafness of both ears, lumbar rheumatism, kidney disease, and general debility.

That he believes himself entitled to the maximum rate of twelve (12) dollars per month under said Act, and he requests an early medical examination to determine his right to said increase.

That said disabilities are not due to vicious habits, and are, to the best of his knowledge and belief, of a permanent character.

That he has-----applied for pension under application No.-----.
That he is a pensioner under Certificate No. 805,507, general law, at Eight (8) dollars per month.

That he has never been employed in the MILITARY OR NAVAL SERVICE otherwise than as stated above.

That he makes this Declaration for the purpose of being placed on the Pension Roll of the United States, under the provisions of the Acts of June 27, 1890, and May 9, 1900. He hereby appoints--
Willard H. Peck of Buffalo, N. Y. his true and lawful Attorney, to prosecute his claim, and he directs that the sum of Ten Dollars be paid to said Attorney.

That his post office address is West Valley, County of Cattaraugus, State of New York.
