

MARSHALL O. BOND

Marshall O. Bond, a resident of this town nearly all his life and a well-to-do and highly respected farmer, died Sunday evening last as a result of a shock of paralysis sustained about a week previous. Deceased was 66 years old and leaves a wife and four children, Mrs. Walter Phillips of Westfield, Mrs. Fred Reynolds and Mrs. Reuben Reynolds of this town, and Hanford Bond, a son who is in the west. One daughter died at the age of 8 years. Mr. Bond married Hannah Searl 44 years ago and when the call for volunteers came during the Civil War he enlisted July 2, 1862 in Co. D. 154th regiment as 1st lieutenant serving until March, 1863 when he resigned his commission and was honorably discharged. He lived about a year in Iowa and during the Pit Hole oil excitement he spent a few years in that section. He received a pension of \$17 per month and was insured in the AOJW for \$2000. He was a member in good standing in the GAR Alanson Crosby Post and this organization had charge of his funeral from the church. The funeral was held today at 12 o'clock at the house and 1 o'clock at church, Rev. G. W. Varnum officiating.
