JOHN ROGERS BURDICK

John Rogers Burdick was born on
August 21st, 1831, in Chenango Coun-
ty, New York, and died at Howell,
Michigan, on February 19th, 1921.

On October 15th, 1859 he was
married to Petsy Ann Austin and to
this couple were born three children.
Mrs. Mary Kirk of Hartland and two
sons, Perry G. Burdick and William
H. Burdick, neither of the latter now
living, the wife and mother died May
25th, 1907.

Mr. Burdick was married on Mar-
15th, 1909 to Mrs. Rose Parne, who
with the daughter, Mrs. Kirk, five
grand-children and five great grand-
children survive him.

In the spring of 1862 he enlisted in
Company G., 154th New York Volun-
teer Infantry of which unit he was al-
most immediately made second Lieu-
tenant to be followed in a few months
by a commission as first Lieutenant.
His regiment was one of those which
received the brunt of Stonewall Jack-
son's famous flanking charge at the
battle of Chancellorsville. He was
honorably discharged on May 22nd,
1863.

Mr. Burdick came to Howell in 1881
and for seventeen years followed the
trade of painter and decorator, to
which he gave the skill of an artisan.
For twenty-one years he was in
charge of the Central school house
and grounds, and it was here that his
kindness of heart and sympathies won
for him the lasting friendship of hun-
dreds of teachers and students. The
dedicatory page of the scroll (the
Howell high school annual publication)
for 1912 reads thusly:

"In appreciation of his many and
faithful years of service in behalf of
the students of the Howell high school,
his book is respectfully dedicated to
John Rogers Burdick."

Mr. Burdick was peculiarly adapted
for service in the sick room, and there
are many in Howell, who will remem-
ber with grateful appreciation his
kind ministrations in the times of
pain and suffering.
