I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your Office of application for Pension No. 2711.091, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office.

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office that William H. Campbell was enrolled on the 25th day of July, 1862, at Goldspring, in Co. "A" 154th Regiment of New York Volunteers, to serve 3 years or during the war, and mustered into service as a Corp. on the 24th day of Sept, 1862, at Jamestown N.Y., in Co. "A", 154th Regiment of New York Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. "A" of that Regiment, for the months of ~~to~~ to October 31st, 1862, he is reported Present. Nov^r Dec. 1862 Absent. Sent to Hosp. in Washington Dec 9. 1862. Same report to Feb 7 1863. March^r and April 1863 Present. May 9th and June 1863 Absent. Missing in action May 2/63 (when he was in action at Chancellorsville, Va.) July^r and Aug. 1863 Absent. Taken prisoner at Chancellorsville, Va. May 2/63. Sept^r and Oct. 1863 "and to April 30/64 Present. May^r and June 1864 Absent. Sent to Hosp. sick May 10. 1864. Indiv. muster out Roll dated May 13. 1865 reports him a Pvt. mustered out on that date at Staehville, Tenn.

Pris of War Records show W. H. C. or Wm. H. C. Campbell, Co. "A" 154th N. Y. Inf. captured at Chancellorsville May 2/63; paroled at City Point Va May 15/63; reported at Camp Parole Med. May 16/63; and is reported as at Camp Convalescent, Va. May 29/63. Sent to Regt. Oct 5/63. No evidence of medical treatment or disability on said records.


