Jesse K. Green Family

Jesse K. Green (1839-1912) married Lucy J. Tarbox, daughter of Jonathan and Rachel Tarbox, born at Brokenstraw, PA. on July 5, 1843. As a girl she moved to Otto, NY where she lived until her marriage on Mar. 17, 1875, after which they moved to Hinsdale.

Jesse Green was a Civil War veteran, having served as Sergeant of Co. 1, 154th New York Volunteers. They had one boy, Glenn, who died in infancy; a daughter Nellie born July 30, 1879 and a son Archie Green by a previous marriage.

Mrs. Green died in June 1905 after many years of suffering and for five years had been unable to lie down. After her death Mr. Green lived with his daughter, Nellie. She was an 1895 graduate of Hinsdale Union School and taught for many years. Mr. Green died on April 25, 1912 at Cohocton, NY where she was teaching.

In later life (1923) Nellie married Everett Phillips of Cuba. She had taught Teacher's Training Class at Cuba. Many of the older pictures of Hinsdale published in this book were from her collection. She died July 23, 1961.

Martin Green Family

Martin Green was born in Spencer, Mass. on May 20, 1828 and died at Little Valley, NY, Aug. 13, 1916. He was buried at Hinsdale Cemetery. He was the great-grandson of Capt. Jabez Green, who served on the staff of George Washington during the Revolutionary War. His saber hangs on a wall at the Shriners on South Western Blvd., Buffalo,
