that period he was paroled and soon after exchanged. On account of ill health he did not return to his company, but was discharged at the close of his term of enlistment, Oct. 24, 1864. He leaves a wife and one child to mourn his loss.

Another of the prominent citizens of Portland has just closed his earthly career. James B. Haywood, living in Portland since 1838, and for the past few years a merchant at Brocton, died very suddenly last Saturday evening at the residence of his father-in-law, Capt. Chester Skinner. Mr. Haywood had been greatly depressed in spirits since his failure in business the past season, and his sudden and unexpected death is thought to have been in some way at least hastened by the influence this unfortunate event was allowed to have over him. Mr. H. was also a soldier in the late war, a member of company "E" 154th regiment, N. Y. volunteers, captain, J. B. Fay, enlisting Aug. 22d, 1862. He followed the fortunes of his regiment until the battle of Chancellorsville, Va., May 2d, 1863, when he was taken prisoner, but paroled and exchanged on the 15th of the same month and again joined his company and was with his regiment on that memorable march of Gen. Sherman's through Georgia to the sea. He was wounded at Resaca, June 15th, 1864, was sent to hospital at Cleveland, Ohio, and after his recovery rejoined his company and regiment at Atlanta, and continued with the army to June 25d, 1865 when he was discharged. He was an excellent man and a good citizen and will long be missed.
