TRUMAN HINMAN, AGED CIVIL WAR VETERAN, IS DEAD

East Randolph Resident Succumbs at Age of 87 — Funeral Tuesday

Randolph, Feb. 12.—Truman H. Hinman, 87 years old, Civil War veteran and retired farmer, died early yesterday morning at his home in East Randolph, where he had resided 33 years, going there from East Otto, where he was born November 22, 1846.

He is survived by two sons, Charles F. Hinman of Victor, Mont., and Burt H. Hinman of East Randolph; one sister, Mrs. Allie Fleming of Medicine Hat, Alta.; one stepson, George Dunn of Randolph; one stepdaughter, Mrs. T. K. H. Robison, of Savannah; 10 grandchildren and three great grandchildren.

Mr. Hinman enlisted in the 154th Regiment, New York State Volunteers, September 9, 1864. He was with General Sherman's army during the famous march to the sea and was honorably discharged June 21, 1865.

Mr. Hinman was the last surviving member of the former A. A. Hall Post, No. 666, G. A. R., of East Randolph, which was consolidated about 30 years ago with the D. T. Wiggins Post of Randolph. With Mr. Hinman's death, James Kelly becomes the sole surviving member of the latter post.

The funeral will be held Tuesday at 2 o'clock at the East Randolph Methodist Episcopal church. The body will lie in state from 12 o'clock Tuesday until the time of the services. Randolph Post, American Legion, will conduct the rites with full military honors.
