The choir of St. John's Evangelical Church will meet tonight.

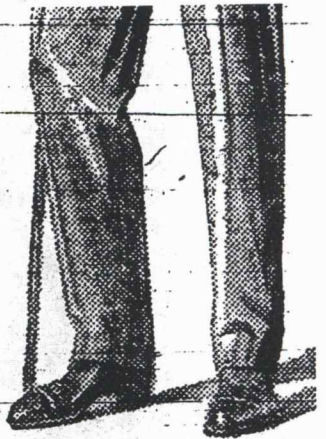
The choir of the First Baptist Church will meet Saturday night at the church.
