HAD BEEN EMPLOYED IN LOCAL MILLS AND FURNITURE FACTORY

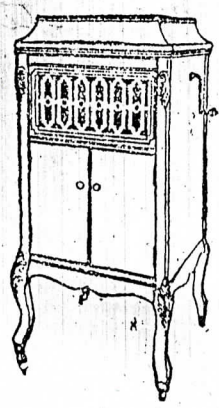
James H. Hunt, whose funeral was held this afternoon at 1:30 from Bradford's undertaking parlors, was until three years ago, when he went to live at Buckley with his son, Burt, a resident of Manistee, living here for about 50 years. His death was caused by heart failure.
