

children: Thomas (1819-1898); Lovina (1822-1891) who married Jeremy Raub; John (1824-1910), who married Kezia Green; Peter (1827); Margaret (1829), married Frederick Head; Jacob (1831); Reuben (1834 ?); Albertus (1837-1890) and Morris (1840-1920) who married first, Rosalie Babcock and second Harriet Kenyon. Morris and Harriet had two children: Clarence Learn married Agnes, my first teacher; and Blanche, who married Fred Brown, had children; Mildred (Lynn & later Henry) Osgood; Laurel (Thurman) Miller, Pearl (Ray) Dunahay and Howard Brown.

Jacob Learn had served in the War of 1812 and four of his sons, Thomas, Jacob, John and Morris were Union soldiers in the Civil War. Jacob Jr. served under General Grant at Vicksburg and died of typhoid fever. Thomas lost his right arm and returned home in 1862; his son Joseph enlisted as his replacement and was also wounded in the neck. John was at Appomattax when General Lee surrendered.

George Learn, also a War of 1812 veteran, married Fanny Spriggle 1799-1871). They had nine children: Samuel (1818); Evan (1820-1886) who married Eliza Miller, daughter of Peter and Margaret Miller; Mary (1824); George (1826) who died young; Nathan (1830-1897) who married Arvilla Cooper; Joseph (1832); Fanny (1834-1908); and Lyman (1839) who died as a child.

Many of the descendants of Jacob and George Learn still live in the Hinsdale - Ischua area.

The Linderman Family

Nicholas Linderman was born in Tompkins County, November 2, 1803. He married there on Jan. 6, 1831, Rebecca Whitlock who was born May 11, 1807. He built a log cabin on Bozard Hill in part of our town that became Ischua. He cut a road to it and brought his bride in 1833. He had a deed for 100 acres of land timbered with hardwood and valuable pine which he converted into shingles, lumber, ashes and black salts which he hauled to Buffalo. Mrs. Linderman died March 10, 1849. On June 3, 1849 Mr. Linderman married Mrs. Sally C. (Hyde) Winters who died in 1888. He had eleven children among them, John,

Ezekiel, Orson, Alonzo, Mary, Lester, and Adeline and Emeline (twins).

John married Ellen Farwell, daughter of Thaddeus and had nine daughters and three sons.

Ezekiel married Adaline Frantz and settled south of Hinsdale on Olean Creek. They had one daughter Ella (A.L.) Brooks, whose son Leon married Vera Marsh. After Mrs. Linderman's death, Ezekiel married Gertrude Kent and had a daughter Phoebe who never married.

Orson Linderman married Hannah Farwell, daughter of Thaddeus.

Co. C Alonzo, a civil war veteran, married Lucinda Searl and had five children; Llewellyn, Ora, Edgar, Frank and Merton Edgar Linderman lived at Ischua and was the father of Norman Linderman who married Marian Brown and was the father of Norma (Morris) Schryver; Gerald who married Sandra Carter and lives on the Bushey Road; Ray and Lyle Merton Linderman married Lillian Peake, daughter of Spencer S. Peake of Hinsdale, a civil war veteran, and had four children; Leland who married Helen Fairfield and had children; Betty (Richard) Hatch, Larry and twins Keith and Paul; Frances who married Donald Watts; Roland who married Arlene Keeler and had a daughter Lisa; Merlyn married Pauline Van Dusen and had children Howard and Ann (Edgar) Frost Howard and his wife, Betty Saylor Linderman, daughter of Eric and Olive Withers Saylor, also Pauline, wife of Merlyn, still live in Hinsdale..... Howard and Betty Linderman had two daughters Lori (Danny) Clovis, Leslie and a son Scott.... Lori has a son Neil and Scott and his wife, have three daughters.

The other children of Nicholas and Rebecca Linderman live away from Hinsdale; as do the children of Mrs. Sally Winters Linderman - Eliza, George and Fon.

Nicholas Linderman died where he first settled on Bozard Hill, aged eighty-three years.
