Matthew Lippert Answered the Last Roll-Call at Age of Seventy-five Years.

Matthew Lippert died Friday, February 24, 1905, at the home of his son in Wheeler township. He was an old pioneer of Seville township, having lived here for more than twenty-five years. Mr. Lippert had been in feeble health for several years but was a hard working, good citizen. He was one of the few old veterans left of the Civil war.

Seven children survive him, two daughters in New York state, one in Shepherd, Mrs. Button in Seville township, two sons in Wheeler township, and his oldest son, Jacob, in Seville.

The remains were buried Monday afternoon in the Seville Center cemetery by the side of his wife, who died two years ago.

James H. Bailey died at his home in Breckenridge about five o'clock Monday morning, April 11, after a brief illness, of less than a week, from a stroke of paralysis.

Mr. Bailey was born in Hillsdale county, Michigan, April 1, 1840, and was married to Miss Melissa Cunningham, June 30, 1861.

In 1878 he moved his family to Gratiot county and for several years was fireman in the different mills, having worked in Peterman's mill, the Breckenridge grist mill and the planing mill, afterwards moving to Alma. Last fall he returned to Breckenridge and built a beautiful home in the south part of town.

To this union nine children were born, of whom seven survive him: Loren A. Bailey, Fred G. Bailey, Mrs. Hattie E. Becker, of Alma; Mrs. May M. Moore, Lon J. Bailey and Lena M. Bailey, of Alma, and Nora, all except Mrs. Becker and Miss Rena living in or near Breckenridge. Besides these he is survived by his wife and eleven grand-children also three brothers, Edwin, of Pittsford Michigan; Loren B., of Toledo, Ohio and Ely, of Hillsdale, who has been here a few days to assist in caring for him.
