Dear Sir,

Your favor of the 8th inst is just received and hasten to reply to same. Your son Hamilton Longcore was undoubtedly taken prisoner at the battle of Getteysburg. I have made inquiries of the Surgeons and members of his company and learn from them that he was neither killed or wounded, and as he is among the missing it is supposed with good reason that he was taken prisinor. I hear, although I do not know it to be a fact that those who were captured at the late battle, have been paroled and are now at parol camp in Ananoplis Md.

I think you can with the best of reasons be assured of his safety and good health and hoping he may soon be restored to his home and friends
