

his children to school Mr. Nelson Bruce  
& Mr. Smith here for a visit they staid  
till after eleven o'clock night we are alone  
Brown no better has quite a fever and  
diarrhoea I don't know as I have sent di-  
arrhoeal yes on other days that is right  
Nature of living is better than ever

Bethel pt cottage 20' collar Aug 20<sup>th</sup> 1863  
Went to church - heard a sermon by Bro  
Lyon occasioned by the death of Wm Hale, a  
soldier of the 154<sup>th</sup> Regt. of N.Y. finished  
a letter read some got from some one  
she likes to leave Me. for supper Sun  
a mild day grows cold towards night  
Wednesday cold and snowy bright frosty  
Went to the Post Office with a letter, says  
a 50 cent bill and two 50 cent bills he helped wash  
This 3<sup>d</sup> grows cold, snows, knitting continued  
sewed some and sanded some wood &  
finished cleaning plantation that I com-  
menced yesterday got pretty tired.  
Wednesday stinging cold too cold to snow help  
do chores took my knitting and sets by the fire  
Joe Brown called and paid Mr. \$5  
for draft on't paid, 50 I had before

DIARY OF RUBA COLE MERRILL

Feb 1st Cottage PO Cattaraugus Co NY, 1863

Went to church heard a sermon by Bro Lyon occasioned by the death of Wm H. Seeker a soldier of the 154. Regt. N.Y.S.V. finished a letter read some got Irvin some supper he likes to tease Ma for supper sun a mild day grows cold towards night

Mon 2d cold and snows quite fast Went to the Post Office with a letter sent a 50 bill and two st to B.M. helped wash.

Tues 3d grows cold, snows, knit some and sewed some and sawed some wood &c finished cleaning pantry that I commenced yesterday got pretty tired.

Wed 4th stinging cold to cold to snow help do chores took my knitting and set by the fire Ira Brown called and paid me \$5. for dress coat paid 50 I had Borrowed called at the store Bt of O S Alden 2 1/2 yards cotton cloth / 63

1 lb of Tea/10/------1.25

1/2 "---Tob 80-----40

Sent to Mr Edgertons & bt 4 lbs of cheese Went to Mr Howletts help fix up things to send to the army sent a small bundle worth \$2.50 or \$3. paid Mr Howlett .50 freight when I paid Mr Rice took .90 worth of .0. stamps so the Money goes wrote a letter to Alva so cold I did not like to go to Bed alone so I set up, till after Midnight, then had to go to Bed well I am glad that I have got a bed that is comfortable wish my Husband & son had as good.

Thurs 5th Very cold the wind blows a perfect gale the air is full of snow all the time wind commenced to blow at Midnight continued with little abatement, till 3 o'clock P.M. about 4 com. to snow eve air quite Mild knit & Sewed some

Fri 6th Irvin taken sick about 3 o'clock in the morning Doctored him some after daylight went out shoveled and swept a road to the barn & hen house. The snow about 1 foot last night Mr Bunce brought his children to School & Mrs. Nelson Bunce & Mrs. Smith here for a visit they staid till after school at night we are alone Irvin no better has quite a fever and diaerrhoea I dont know as I have spelt diarrhoea yes cobb says that is right

Satur 7th Irving is better this morning clouds passed away the sun shone in all its splendor through the day

Sun 8th not very well wrote to E.P & P.B.C. commenced to write to Husband

Mon 9 Betsy Smith called washed some in P.M. went to E Roberts

tues 10 Recd 6.50 of Sarah ann Reale went to C. Conners and bought a shall

Wed 11 paid C. Darbee 3.50 difference between stoves and .50 that Husband owed Henry Darbee went to see \_\_\_\_\_ sick child took care of it part of Night

Thurs 12th help fix Meeting House

Fri 13th Made some preperations for quartrly Meeting Rec a call capt \_arrett and wife heard from friends in Leon rec 36 dollars from Husband & son

Sat 14th pleasant went to quartly Meeting Bro Hanford, Wife, and daughter Mrs Hull, Wm Hunt, & Eliza Merrill staid with me did not go to church in eve

Sun 15th unable to attend church about sick a fine day and good sleighing. Mother Merrill called

Mon 16 Feel better had team harnessed in the morning went to Mr Bunces carried a ham to smoke went from there to Mr Scovills paid him by letting him have one allotment \$18, & \$1.50 beside took up a note went from there to Guile Johnsons let him have the other allotment \$18 paid him \$10, interest and Rec \$8 of him \$5 \_\_\_\_\_ Silver creek Bank No 6564 2 on Marine B No 6158 June 30 1862 B \_\_\_\_\_ on Albany Exchange Bank No 2569 May 1 1862

Wed 18 Cloudy damp weather quite unwell not able to sit up all day

Thurs 19th rainy. more unwell than yesterday

Fri 20th frose some last night pleasant the meeting continues, bad roads, Nancy & Irvin Recd a letter from Pa for which they are thankful.

Sat 21 The pain in my limbs some better not able to get about much mild and pleasant.

Sun 22d 5 o'clock P.M. after noon has snowed fast all day set up in bed and wrote some to Husband Nancy went to church but few in attendance was thought best to close the protracted effort the weather likely to be so bad & so little interest manifested

Mon 23d a remarkable clear and pleasant day the sun shines with almost the splendor of a june day want to go to the Barn but cant

Tues 24th cloudy but air mild rather cold good sleighing I guess the sun is resting after shining after shining so bright yesterday sarah ann Reale called to see me my limbs are better

Wed 25th Recd 2 letters by George Reale he has come from the Army called in company with his wife was extremely glad to see him he got home at 6 o'clock this morning, left the army at 10 o'clock mon Mr John Darbee & wife called Mrs Susanna Gardner came on a visit Mrs Medberry called am verry tired rains.

Thurs 26th Recd quite a number of calls yesterday got very tired dont feel quite as well Mrs Ira Browne called today Leonard Merrill has come Well Leonard has gone we had quite a chat I read letters to him till I was tired enough. a damp lowery day sleighing all gone here Leonard offered me 25. dollars all cash for our best cow I think she is worth 30.20 I dont sell to him. quite windy but warm

Fri 27th cold raw wind the most of the day. not cold enough to frieze any have sewed what I could on \_\_\_\_\_ shirts for Alva, cant do much got Mrs Howlett to help me

Sat 28th As beautiful a morning as ever shone froze a little last night a white frost this morning I feel quite well better than I have before in a week 8 o'clock A.M. 24 years to day since I became a Wife. some cloudy towards night.
