dear rhoda i receved yours of the loth a few days after i wrote my last 1 am glad to know that you have jot the bounty 1 got two month pay yesterday day i enclose a 20 doller check which you can take to the bank and get the money i expect to recieve 4 month pay nex mont but cannot tel how much longer i may have to wate you wanted to know if i wanted some dried appels and berries i leave it to your self to do as you think best about sending any thing i have anought to eat of such as it is and not very bad nether our bread is what we call hared tack it looks very much like soda crackers but is very hard i think i will and you a sample of it soon we have plenty pork and fresh beer beans or rice nearly every day and sometimes potatoes dried appels molases and every day good big spoon ful of shuger plenty coffey sometimes tea and in cold stormey wather a drink of . whiskey if you send me any thing i want some thing better then dried appels berries would be very good and two or three pownds of butter in as small a tin pail as you can get with a cover to it it would be very useful when i got it emty i would like sone chease afew very noice cookies and a pound of saledratus some paper and any xxxxx thing good you pleace that will keep four or rive weeks but not to be more then twenty pounds box and all i shuld think that ten or twelve pounds would be anought i have told yoy what we cat i must now tell you what kind of houses we live in every man has a pece of tent it takes 4 peaces to make a roof so 4 men goes to gather and bilds a log house of poles and covers it with a chimney with shick and mud i now live with three men from portland sargent xxx barnhart mr slausen and mr page all members of the me church dear rhoda remember me to all my friends and in prayr
