Doar rhoda I wreat more yesterday than I expected to but 1 must tell about the negroes and things on the north side of the river where we stayed more then two weeks they knew nothing about the presedents procklamation tell we came there thangh a great many hed left before some stayed that their masers said that the yankies wanted to get them to washington and kill them to eat but they said they maver believed it and when they saw negro teamsters in the army they knew better our officers forraged a good deal for the teems though those and the negroes would tell them were to find their corn and anything the wanted the folks about there kid everything I have been wateing for the mail to come in but it is command and no letter for me i receved a letter from mary a stowell last nite i will send her one today.

tell Willey he must be a good boy go to school and learn so that he can teach ida yours James D Quilliam
