I recieved yours yesterday but my box was not at Chatanooga yesterday Mr Cliffard was their and there was nothing there for the regement but I think that it will be here soon I have been to sunday school to day last sunday I was on picket and could not attend today the General spok very affectanantly about the use of profain language and said that he had thaught of isuing an order against it but as orders do not reach the hart and there ware orders already against it he thaught it might do no good and he exorted the soldiers to help him to show those who thaught that a man could not serve both God and his Countrey that they are rong

We have a great many men to home who would be ashame to stoot so low as to have any thing to do with a sunday school they think they air two old to tend to any thing of that kind they have more inportant buisnes but here is a man that have the care and the life of many thousands trusted to him and he is not above going to sunday school and learn Children to read and talk to them about the love of Jesus and that when their fathers and brothers many of them air in the rebble army it is not anought we conqvar the reble army to restore the unian but we have to conquer the people with love and there naver was an armey whuch undertook that task before and I hope that this may be the last was where it is nessesary to use the wepans of deth
