I reckon we have made about \$3000 since we have been in Virginia as this is the third house we have built and the report is that we have got to leave this in two or three days on a expedition. If the movements which are on foot are successful that the war will be short and they are not there, there's no telling when and where it will end but I guess Frant, I have wrote enough about the war so I will change the subject. You can't guess what I had for breakfast. Well, It was soft bread. I tell you what- it was good. We had a lot of butter on it only cost \$1 per pound not very cheap at half price. I wish you could just step in and see our parlor and carpet. It is evergreen although when we get it black with mud. What will you do now Frmat, your Father is not where he can write about me. I can do just as I please and you won't know anything about it. But them I will try and do right when I am doing anything I always ask down to Charelton, but we can tell mothing about it until we get started so we do not worry about it at all. We have made up our minds that if we go we shall see more of the country but I think I have seen enough unless it is betterl. For my part, I would be willing to settle down and take Dinah for a wife but if it is necessary, I can travel my three years out and three more and fight besides. But I wanted to count and let our head men fight the Rebels and not fight amongst themselves. I think if our generals take the right course now and move cautious and not let the Rebs get the start of them and when they do strike9, strike with all their force that this rebellion will soon be closed! What would Frant say if she should see me. I was thinking this morning how I would like to spend I pleasant Sunday at home once mere. Oh would it not be blass to be free and happy once more. I get a little

downhearted sometimes when I think how I am sold cut for three years but I guessit will come all right. This is the second letter I have wrote to you since I got yours but them I use to go down to your house as much as three times and you did not more to our house once. I will send you a ring in _____ it is not very side ork costly but will serve to while away a little time and you can see what we can do that keeps us also busy. We can't get time to write but I must close. Write soon and remember me as your true friend. I premise to write a better letter but have failed.
