

LUTHER STANLEY'S DEATH DUE TO PARALYTIC STROKE

Aged Former Resident Passed
away Wednesday at the
Home of Mr. Stone.

Luther Stanley died Wednesday evening at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Edwin Stone in this village. Mr. Stanley was a resident of Forestville, and with his wife had been spending the winter among relatives and friends in this section. He has not been in vigorous health for several months, and on Sunday afternoon suffered a stroke of paralysis. His death followed three days later.

Mr. Stanley was son of Isaac Stanley who was one of the pioneers of Randolph; he was also half brother of Addison C. Stanley and of Mrs. L. J. Dewey, both of this place. His home has been at Forestville several years, where he conducted a cheese factory. He was born at Conewango about 70 years ago, and was married in 1867 to Miss Susan Brown, who survives, with one adopted son, Claude Stanley, who resides in the state of Washington.

He was a member of Star of the West Encampment, No. 85, of Fredonia; Canton Fredonia, No. 64; and the L. O. O. F. of Forestville. He was also a member of Co. A, 154th regiment, N. Y. Vols., and was in service four months before being discharged on account of sickness.

It has been arranged to conduct the funeral Sunday afternoon at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Stone, at 1 p. m., and interment will be made at East Randolph.
