I am still better and were I at home I could hardly excuse myself from attending to professional business as my health is now.—but I shall remain here until I am well. If by any accident your letters have gone to the Reg't. the Lord only knows when I will get them. Write won't you? Make my apologies to Mr. Wing and Mr. McVean for not answering their kind letters.
