Except for three or four thrusts at the Chicago Tribune, the address was free from the caustic which in the campaign, just closed has marked the colonel's campaign efforts. "American business today is the

The plan, he said, had reached its highest state of development in Denmark but it has survived the test of famine, despot. ism and pestilence in soviet Russis.

In defense of his limitation of capital's, earnings to five percent, Mr. Brookhart referred to the growth of national wealth since the beginning of the republic and declared it had averaged more than four percent.

In closing the speaker outlined a plan whereby his cooperative plan could be made international in its scope and "do more to end war than all the leagues and other political contrivances that have ever been devised".
