THE FRENCH IN LOUISIANA.—A French paper, *L'Italie*, has the following: "We learn that a great number of families of French extraction in Louisiana, whose property has been subjected to sequestration by the recent acts of General Butler, have appealed to the treaty of 1803, by which that colony was ceded to the United States. In that diplomatic convention it was stipulated by France that the full enjoyment of their liberty and their property and the unrestricted observance of their religion was to be guaranteed to the citizens of that colony.—The families in question claim the intervention of France to obtain the fulfillment of these clauses of the primitive cession."
