TRUMAN D. BLOWERS Civil War Veteran

Truman D. Blowers, a veteran of the Civil War and for many years prominent business man of West Valley, died at the home of his daughter, Mrs Fred Stephens, at Salamanca on Friday, Feb. 27th. 1920 following an illness of several months duration, aged 83 years.

Mr. Blowers was born in Oneida County in this state but removed at an early date to East Otto and from there to West Valley where he conducted a grocery store for 25 years. He served for three and a half years in the Civil War as a member of Co. G. 154th N. Y. Volunteers and was honorably discharged in 1864. He was a member of the Baptist Church, was of a kindly and pleasant disposition and was esteemed and beloved by all who knew him. His wife died some years ago. He is surviven by three daughters, Mrs. Fred Stephens of Salamanca and M:s Frank Steffenhagen and Mrs. Geo Steffenhagen of West Valley, a sister. Mrs. Eunice Turner, of Chili, Wis., and six grandchildren.
