

JOEL B. TORRANCE

Son of Garwood M. and Persis C. (Bassett) Torrance, was born October 28, 1839, at Randolph, Cattaraugus County, New York. In the Civil War he served in Co. H, 154th N.Y. Vol. He marched with Sherman to the Sea. October 15, 1869, he married Eleanor C. Wallace. After her death he married Hattie Churchill; his third wife was Mrs. Rhoda Churchill. He died December 22, 1903. He had no children. [Buried in Randolph Cemetery].

THOMAS SAWYER PHILLIPS

was born in the Town of Stockton, County of Chautauqua, State of New York, January 24, 1843. The name of his father was Thomas D. Phillips. The name of his mother was Loretta Hartford. He enlisted September 3, 1862. He was mustered in the service of the United States from the Town of Stockton as a private in Company F, 154 Regt. N.Y. Vol. Inf. September 24, 1862. At the time of his enlistment he was a single man. His occupation was that of a dentist. He was discharged from the service of the United States June 1st, 1865. His post office address in 1901 is Buffalo, Erie Co., New York. He died at Milwaukee, Wis. January 6, 1915. Funeral services at the crematory in Buffalo, New York Saturday afternoon, January 9, 1915 under the auspices of Washington Lodge No. 240, F. & A.M.
