Dear Sister

As I have a few spare moments to
spend in writing I thought I would
write you a few lines to inform
you that I am well and hope
this will find you the same
I left home the six of September
fore the army I went to Atlanta
I tude there till the fifteenth of
November then we started fore Savannah
where we are yet but we shall march
from here tomorrow morning fore
Charleston South Carolina or Richmon
we dont know which, we was one
month on the Rode when we came
to Savannah how long we shall
be on the rode this we dont
know but we think that we shall
be a bout thirty days on the rode
if we have us god a time on this
