It becomes our sad office to chronicle the death of Addison Stone at the home of his son William, in Greenwood, Nebraska, Thursday, June 30. He was away on a visit in hopes that the change might benefit his health. He was ill for a long time, but it was not thought that the end was so near. He was of good old New York stock, and was born and for many years lived at Olean in that state. He was sixty-three years and ten months old. The body will be brought here for interment and the funeral will be this morning, July 2, at 10 o'clock, from St. Michael's church.

Mr. Stone came here in the early seventies and has been identified with the growth of the city from the start. For many years he was a merchant and he also owned a fine farm a short distance south of the city. He was an old soldier, patriotic, wholesouled, and upright in all his dealings, and his example and conservative judgment have left their mark in the development of the city. His wife and four sons survive him. His sons are grown to manhood and are well educated, industrious young men who are a credit to the community where they were raised. The ranks of the old soldiers are thinning fast, but the principles their sturdy characters represented still live, and among the men who lived up to and did his part in advancing them, the name of Addison Stone deserves honorable mention.

6 7/7/1904: Death of Addison Stone

The community was saddened last Thursday by the news of the death of one of our oldest and most respected citizens, Addison Stone, at Greenwood, Neb., where be had gone for a visit with his son Will. While it was known that Mr. Stone was in very poor health, and that his death was expected, yet the news came as a shock to his many friends here. His demise removes one who has been it prominent business man of this city for the greater part of three decades. The funeral was from St. Michael's Church, Father Delfosse officiating.

Addison Stone was born August 30, 1841, at Olean, N. Y. When it young man lie came its far west as Havana, Ill., where he resided until 1872, when he came to Merrick County, Nebraska. While living in Illinois he was united in

marriage to Miss Catherine Joyce, who survives him. children were born to them, Will, who Is In the mercantile business at Greenwood; John, Who is now In the West; Clement, practicing medicine at Doniphan; and Jamie, of this city. Up to a few months ago Mr. Stone was in the clothing business in this city, but, failing health made it necessary for him to retire from active life. came too late, however, and he gradually passing away at his son's residence.

A model citizen, a quiet, unassuming Christian, a loyal friend — such a man was Addison Stone. Truly, it, could be said of him, "The path of the just is as a shining light, that shineth ever and ever more fully unto the perfect, day." G. A. R. and W. R. C. assisted in the services and a large concourse of old friends paid their last tribute to the dead by their presence. After the storms and trials of a pioneer life, peace from the world's jangling tumult has come to him. May he rest in peace until the New Day dawns.
