Simon C. Pool, Capt Co B 134th N.Y. vols being
duly sworn, deposes and says that the Ordnance
and Ordnance Stores enumerated below to the best of
his memory and belief were turned over to J. A.
Allen Regt Q. M. 134th N.Y. vols, and that the Receipts
therefor were not obtained for the reasons following.

On the march of the Regt. to which his Co.
belongs from Stafford Court House Va. to Gettys-
burgh Pa. in June 1863 by reason of sick-
ness and excessive fatigue the men in
whose possession these stores were, became
incapacitated to carry them, and the same
were turned over as above stated, and in-
-random Receipts therefor taken; that regular
and full Receipts could not be taken from
the fact that all Books, Papers and Desks
were packed up and the rapidity of the
march rendered it absolutely impossible to
procure a wagon for that purpose; that the
battle of Gettysburgh intervened before he
could have taken proper Receipts, and at
which place and on the 1st day of July
1863 he was taken a prisoner of war and
remained so until his escape on the
17th day of February 1865; that upon
his return to the Regt the Q. M.

(J. G. Allen) sent resigned and long since
sent gone home: and that Deponent found
that his Papers and Memoranda and nearly
all data had been lost and that he can
not now nor could he at any time
since since 1st day of July 1863 obtain
said Receipts.
