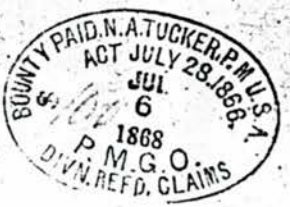

OATH OF IDENTITY.

..... William F. Vinton
of the Town of Edinborough
County of Cattaraugus in the State of New York
on this 10th day of February in the year
of thousand eight hundred and sixty six personally appeared
before me, the undersigned, a Justice of the Peace for the County
of Town above mentioned,
who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the
identical William F. Vinton who was
a Principal Drumsman in the Company commanded by
Captain in the Regiment
W. R. G. commanded by Genl. S. P. Palmer
that he enlisted on the 30th day of August 1862
for the term of three years and was discharged
at Conamatic on the 5th day
of July 1865 by reason of illness

and subscribed to before me the day and year above written.
