WALSH, MICHAEL.—Age, 38 years. Enlisted, August 29, 1862, at Humphrey, to serve three years; mustered in as private, Co. I, September 25, 1862; wounded and captured in action, May 2, 1863, at Chancellorsville, Va.; paroled, no date; absent, in Elizabeth Hospital, Washington, D. C., since December 5, 1863, and at muster-out of company; also borne as Waulch and Walch.
