I was so pleased to hear from you and thrilled with the material that you sent. Now I know why I didn't find anything about the 154th at Gettysburg in 1985. What a touching experience to visit Gettysburg. What an awful war.

I am sending copies of everything I received from the National Archives, rather than pick and choose. It makes for good reading.

Now, as to any direct descendants of Henry F. Whipple (the "F" is very important as you will see when you read the documents). I am enclosing a family sheet which shows that James Spencer Whipple was still in Salamanca when he died in 1942. I would guess that his descendants are still there.

Henry was my great-grandfather's uncle. My great-grandfather, Joseph, joined the New York 64th. He lived in Little Valley, New'York. He moved to Colorado later and probably kept in contact. At any rate, the Whipples lived in Salamanca, Little Valley and Steamburgh. I think a phone book would be the best bet. I'll try to get one and make some contacts if Whipples are in the book. It's worth a try. I, too, would like to see a picture.

I have ordered two copies of <u>The Hardtack Regiment</u> and two copies of the booklet, <u>Colonel Warner--one</u> copy is for my son. I am enclosing a check for \$10 to cover the cost of <u>the Coster Avenue Mural</u> booklet that you so kindly sent and to ask that you send another.

Thanks again for the "goodies" and thanks for all of your research and effort on behalf of the New York 154th. I know that they would be pleased.

I will pursue this and do the best I can to obtain any mementos that might be available. I have found (in writing to Georgia) that distant cousins are not always happy to hear from other distant cousins. Oh, well!

Carrier alle tall Henry Francisco Whipple was born Oct 20 1819 in Silver Lake Susquehanna County Pennsylvania and died July 9 1864 in the Confederate Prisoner of War Camp in Andersonville Georgia. He was married to Martha A Hatch May 19 1844 the daughter of Dr Stephen and Mary Hatch (Martha Hatch was born Mar 19 1826 and died Feb 14 1896). They made their home in Salamanca New York. Henry Whipple enlisted in the Civil War Aug 30 1862 in the New York Regiment 154 Co H Orderly Sergent. He was taken prisoner of the Southern Army from Belle Isle and the died in the Confederate Prison et Andersonville Georgie. He fought in the battle of Chancellarville and at Gettsyburg Penn. He lies buried in trington, Cenetery in Washington D.C. John we dente A (Appel'sen - mail) In religion he was a Quaker.
