Compound comminuted fracture of Femur. Patient wounded at battle of Chancellorsville May 3^d - was carried immediately to Aquia Creek Hospital where he remained until the 14th of June '63. When brought to this Hospital he was very much prostrated. Stomach became very irritable - constant nausea. He grew gradually worse and died from exhaustion July 31, 4 P.M.
No previous history could be obtained from him.
