It appears from the records filed in this Office, that Asa S. Wing Private to G. 154 N. Y. received a flesh wound of neck at the battle of Kennesaw Mt. Ga. June 26 + 27 1864. He entered Totten G. H. Louisville Ky. July 5 1864 from the Field with G. S. W. of the neck and ear left side received at Kennesaw Mt. June 26 1864 and was furloughed Sept 19 1864 for 30 days. He entered No. 7 (Dran) G. H. Louisville Ky Dec 15 1864 from furlough from Totten Hosp. with G. S. W. of neck right side, flesh, and was returned to duty Dec 16 1864

G., 154th Regiment of New York Volunteers, to serve 3 years or during the war, and mustered into service as a Private on the 24th day of September, 1862, at Jonestown N.Y., in Co. G., 154th Regiment of New York Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. G., of that Regiment, for the months of May, June, 1863, he is reported - Present for duty - Faction of Co. June 30/63 - Emmulating at July Aug 63 - Taken prisoner at Gettysburg July 1 then Dec 63 - Present for duty - May June 64 - slight wounded in Gen. Knapp's raid June 16/64 - July Aug 64 - slight wounded June 26/64 in Gen. Knapp's raid - Jan'y, Feb'y, 65 - Present for duty - Mar. Apr. 65 - Taken prisoner March 25, 1865 - Indian & W. Bell reports him - Mustered out then discharged July 1, 1865 - Prisoner of war 27 Mar. 65 - 5 May 65 - as Asst. G. Wing - First was in action at Fair Knob Va June 16, 1864 - Crossed at Stafford Va. May 7/63 - Arr. camp June 12, marched to Red Bank Church - On the 13, went to Cattle Station on the 14, marched Centerville - On the 17, left for Iron Creek via Gum Springs remained during, picket duty until the 24, when crossed down to Edwards Ferry - On the 25, crossed into Maryland, marched to Jefferson - On the 26, went to Smith Mountain, marched from thence to Frederick, from thence to Emmelstung on the 29, where remained up to June 30/63

 All the blanks in this form should be carefully filled and the requirements of the notes carefully observed.  
 An honorable discharge from the service in the army is necessary.  
 Declarations of claimants, either for original pension or for increase of pension already granted, must be made before a court of record or before some officer thereof having custody of its seal, said officer being fully authorized and empowered to administer and certify under oath or affirmation relating to any pension application therefor.  
 The claimant's identity and loyalty must be proven by two witnesses, certified by the judicial officer to be respectable and credible, who are present and witness the signature of the declarant, and certify to his identity and loyalty under oath or affirmation.  
 Certificates and other papers should be as legible and as clear in statement as possible.  
 Where any evidence is already on file in any Department of the Government, a definite description of and specific reference to it will render it available in any subsequent claim.  
 The post office address (naming street and number in all large cities) of the applicant, attorney and witnesses, should be embodied in or accompany every application, and all change of residence of said parties, while communicating with the Pension Office or the pension agents, should be stated.  
 The fees for the prosecution of claims for pensions will not be allowed to exceed twenty-five dollars; no part of which is payable before the certificate for the pension has been issued.  
 Pensions are, by law, exempted from any liability on account of the obligations of the pensioners, and no lien upon them can be recognized.  
 All facts, testimony of which is required to establish a claim, must be proven by the affidavits of two or more credible witnesses, unless other evidence is specified.  
 The statements of claimants, unless duly corroborated, are not accepted as evidence.  
 Testimony, in support of allegations made in a declaration, may be taken before any officer whose authority and signature are duly certified and who shall disclaim any interest, direct or indirect, in the prosecution of the claim.  
 Persons desiring to complete claims pending at the death of the claimants, must furnish a duly verified certificate of their authority as heirs or legal representatives.  
 With all claims for arrears, increase, or restoration to the rolls, the original pension certificate must be returned, or explanation of its absence must be given under oath.  
 To facilitate the prosecution of claims, all the requisite evidence that is available should be forwarded with the application.

The Act of June 27, 1890, REQUIRES, in case of a soldier:

1. An honorable discharge (but the certificate need not be filed unless called for.)
2. A minimum service of ninety days.
3. A permanent physical disability not due to vicious habits. (It need not have originated in the service.)
4. The rates under the act are graded from \$5 to \$12, proportioned to the degree of inability to earn a support, and not affected by rank held.
5. A pensioner under prior laws may apply under this one, or a pensioner under this one may apply under other laws, but he cannot draw more than ONE pension for the same period.
