DECLARATION FOR PENSION. ACT OF 6 FEB '70

On this... 9th day of August, A. D. one thousand nine hundred and nine, personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace within and for the county and State aforesaid, Andrew G. Park who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he... 70 years of age, and a resident of Dayton county of Cattaraugus, State of New York; and that he is the identical person who was ENROLLED at Jamstown, N.Y. under the name of Andrew G. Park, on the 24th day of September, 1862 as a private, in Co. B. 154th N.Y.S. Vol.

in the service of the United States, in the Civil war, and WAS HONORABLY DISCHARGED at New York City, on the 16th day of June, 1865

That he also served Under Arms

That his personal description at enlistment was as follows: Height, 5 feet 9 1/2 inches; complexion, Dark; color of eyes, Blue; color of hair, Light; that his occupation was Farmer; that he was born August 16th, 1839 at Dayton, N.Y.

That his several places of residence since leaving the service have been as follows: from 1865 to 1870 in Leon, N.Y. Bal of unit in Dayton, N.Y.

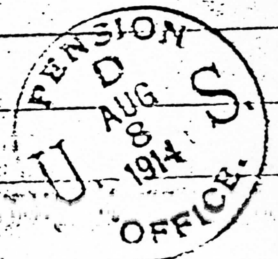
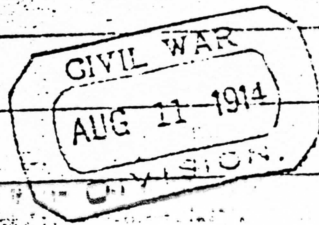
