HISTORY

Commencement speakers are eloquently unanimous in reminding those about to leave college (with the diploma, of course) that they have spend the happiest days of their lives in that environment. We have not had it told to us yet, formally and officially, but we are ready, after some reminiscing, to admit that, if they were not in every respect our happiest, they were certainly the most memorable.

During our stay at St. Bonaventure we gleaned as much as the texts had to offer; we received from our instructors knowledge enough to start us out in life successfully; we learned from the Friars, Fathers and Brothers, the lessons of wisdom that will guarantee our ending life successfully. And from all we got the happy memories we shall always cherish.

"Saint Bonaventure" was just a word in our limited vocabularies when we arrived here one September day four years ago. We learned a new word, even while we were unpacking, from the sophomores who kept muttering something that sounded like "rules" while they gave us the once over.

It took about three weeks for the word to become a reality, thanks to Senate President Pete Fennell and Company, who made Butler Gym reverberate weekly with off-tune choruses of the "Brown and White."

By Thanksgiving, we had lived up to our advance billing, "Hard as nails, tough as bricks, we're the Class of '56." Following the capture of a greased pig in Forness Stadium, we looked forward to greater things!

As Bonaventure men, bound together by the ordeal of rules, we developed a keen sense of class spirit, and, in a highly competitive contest, elected Jerry Schlee president, to be assisted by Vice-President Don Cecere, Secretary Jerry Howard, and Treasurer Sal Bordonaro.

The victories expected from the Brown Indians on the basketball court never quite materialized; but our spirit certainly shone, at home, in Buffalo, and during the New York excursion. The Metropolitan jaunt was a success, too, despite the loss to Seton Hall as Mal Duffy made his basketball debut, because it netted \$1500 for the Father Frawley Mission Fund.

It was in the same season of 1952 when another side of the school spirit revealed itself as Bona men volunteered to form search parties for the four Niagara students who lost their lives in a plane crash.

With the coming of spring, the sun shone once more on Cattaraugus County, while the moonlight, enhanced by the music of Elliot Lawrence, set the theme for the Juniors' "Evening in Paris."

Led by Senators Bill Schrauth, Tim Leary, and Jerry Howard, we looked forward, as domineering sophomores do, to the resumption of controversial Freshman Rules. The system may have changed slightly, but we enthusiastically improved upon the lessons learned the previous year.

In our first effort to improve the social life at Bona, a dance we sponsored was edged into the red by an unseasonable blizzard, despite the work of class officers Jerry Schlee, Jim Pallone, Don Easton and Joe Nagel.

A cheerleaders Club was formed by class members, and, with the return of Paddy Ryan to Bonaventure, was ready to provide our new coach, Eddy Donovan, with the necessary moral support.

That same year we saw WOFM return to the air after many years of silence, in time to announce the granting of a government loan to Bona for the construction of a new dorm. As sophomores we were instrumental in the success of the first Moving Up Day, featuring a banquet and parade.

A more serene note was struck by the retreat we made during Holy Week, just before going home to hunt for Easter eggs! It came a little late, but somebody laid another kind of egg when, despite a quadrangle full of French-speaking students, the school band, and assorted fire apparatus for the appearance of Father Augustine Sepinski, O.F.M., Minister General of the Franciscan Order, the schedule went right along without a free day!

There was a change, however, when the class elections brought in Joe Erena to succeed Jerry Schlee. We closed our second successful year with a gigantic Marian Year Rally as a light rain sprinkled Forness Stadium.

We returned to Bona in September, 1954, as upperclassmen, and immediately went to work to break the social silence of the campus. WOFM's Fall Festival made its initial appearance at Bonaventure, and, through the efforts of co-chairmen Jim Arcara and Bob Paradise, was both a social and financial success, as were the semi-weekly Jazz Sessions at the Clubhouse. Under Eddy Donovan the Brown Indians enjoyed a moderately successful season, finishing second in the first Queen City Invitational Tournament. Recordsetting Mal Duffy completed an illustrious Bona court career with 445 points, including 36 against Ithaca one December evening in the Olean Armory.

It was also during our junior year that the campus face-lifting job began, with the passing of the barracks and the completion of Falconio and Robinson Halls. The new dorm occasioned another display of that school spirit which by now was ours. Under the direction of the class officers, whose ranks were most ably filled by a new senator, Paul Killian, and a new secretary, Bob Cross, we rallied to the plea of the Reverend Juvenal Lalor, O.F.M., our president, and made the Drape Drive a memorable occasion.

By the time we had moved into the new residence halls, plans were well under way for what was to be our finest achievement, the Junior Prom.

The Silver Dollar Weekend, patrons, decorations, orchestra, and the various other details were arranged; to result in the biggest and best Prom weekend ever to hit Bona. In May the culmination of the united efforts of co-chairmen Pete Kaley and Jim Arcara, was realized when we danced away the "Spring Nocturne" to the sophisticated swing of Les Elgart, "America's most popular dance band." It was at the Prom that official

citation was made of Arcara whose efforts won him the title of, "Junior Man of the Year."

When we returned in the fall of 1955 to end our college careers, we encountered many significant changes in the University administration. Father Brian Lhota, O.F.M., whom we had known for three years as a teacher, was now President of the University, with Father Simeon Capizzi, O.F.M., the Dean of Men.

As a class, we were determined not to sit back and merely await graduation, but rather carried on the tradition of leadership begun as freshmen. Led by Student Senate President Bill Schrauth and Senators John Szadlowski, Bill Zeis and Paul Killian, together with class officers Jim Arcara, Cliff Mayotte, Bob Cross and Joe Nagel, we laid plans for the many events which proved so unforgettable.


An excursion to Philadelphia and New York City climaxed a basketball season, dampened by the worst Canisius defeat in court history.

Socially, the year was an outstanding success, commencing with the Senior Picnic in September at the State Park and continuing with the host of post-game dances in Buffalo and Olean, to the Senior Ball in May and, finally Senior Week and our graduation.

It all adds up to what we said it would: happiest or not, the years at Bonaventure have been truly most memorable.






Athletic Director

Schlee showed his leadership qualities on the basketball court also. Never a high scorer, he fitted smoothly into the Bona pattern system that depends chiefly on close teamwork.

Basketball Coach

Congratulations for Bona's surprising 14-12 season must go primarily to Coach Eddie Donovan. Once again, as in his two previous seasons at Bona, Coach Donovan brought the Brown Indians through to a winning season.

Faced with an extremely rough schedule after the loss of the three top scorers from the '54-'55 team, Donovan directed his youngsters with a capable hand.

A coach must always be looking ahead—to the next game or to the next season. From past performances it is certain that Coach Eddie Donovan can combine this foresight with his willingness to win and continue to bring victorious basketball teams to Bona.





Brendan McCann

Junior Brendan McCann, who was chosen to fill the shoes of one of Bonaventure's all-time greats, fellow Brooklynite Mal Duffy, carried out this chore in an excellent manner.

In addition to his superb playmaking, McCann led the team in scoring with 376 points in 23 games for a 16.3 average.

He was also second on the team in rebounding with a 142 total.

McCann's best game of the year was against Xavier in the Queen City Tournament when he hooped 31 points in a losing cause.

Like his illustrious predecessor, Duffy, McCann attended Manual Training High in Brooklyn.

The 6 ft. 2 in. Junior has a good jump shot and a fine set to combine with his thread-like passes.

St. Bona's 85 St. Vincent 67

Bona's Brown Indians opened their 1955-56 basketball campaign on a winning note by handily disposing of a much-improved St. Vincent's five 85-67 at the Olean-Armory. The Bearcats never led as Bona captured its 57th straight home court victory.

Coach Eddie Donovan had a difficult time selecting his starting five but finally led off with Jerry Schlee, Jim Crough, Brendan McCann, Bobby Clark and Ernie Rokose.

A combination of balanced scoring and rugged rebounding spelled victory as six Bonnies hit double figures.

Crough paced the scoring parade with 18 points followed by reserve John Connors with 14 and McCann with 13.

Connors, a sophomore from Syracuse, N. Y., came off the bench in his first varsity game to play outstanding basketball.

But it was fine team play and a 40% field goal shooting percentage that gave the Bonnies their first victory of the season.

After defeating both St. Vincent's and Sampson Air Force Base at home, the Brown Indians traveled to Buffalo's Memorial Auditorium to meet the "Stokes-less" Frankies from St. Francis of Loretto, Pa.

A large early season crowd was on hand to watch the Bonnies upset St. Francis 69-63 in their first big test of the season.

Jerry Schlee, who seems to play his best ball against the Frankies, scored 16 besides rebounding quite effectively.

Schlee opened the scoring with a jump, Jimmy Crough followed with a tap, and the Bonnies were on their way.

Jim McClellan, Maurice Stokes' successor, was capably bottled up and none of his teammates were able to provide the needed scoring punch.


Although Bona's lead was never in jeopardy, the outcome was in doubt until Ernie Rokose canned a pair of foul shots and a layup in the closing seconds.


Brendan McCann trailed Schlee in the scoring column with 15 points.

Jimmy Crough

Jimmy Crough, from Christian Brothers Academy in Syracuse, N. Y., has been one of Bona's finest scoring guards in his abbreviated career at Bonaventure.

Unluckily sidelined by a hepatitis attack last season which cut short his playing time, Crough rebounded to take over a starting role this year.

High scorer in both the Georgetown and Duquesne games when he scored 22 and 20 points respectively, Crough possesses an excellent set shot and can hook from inside with either hand.

His patent one-hand jump was one of the finest on the squad.

In 23 games the 6 ft. 2 in. junior fashioned an 11.7 average. An NCAA ruling has cut short his career although Crough will not graduate until next year.

Met Trip Riding the crest of a three-game winning streak, Bona traveled to New York City to play three leading Metropolitan area clubs, St. Francis of Brooklyn, Iona and Fordham.

The Bonnies dropped their first game of the season to St. Francis' Terriers 79-77 to open the Yuletide jaunt. Danny Lynch, Terrier mentor, summed up the game in these words, "They have a very fine club and we were lucky to win."

The Indians, trailing by 11 at the half, were closing in when time ran out. Brendan McCann led the Bona scoring with 23 points. The St. Francis quint took down twice as many rebounds as Bona.

Still smarting from the previous night's defeat, the Indians went up to Westchester to grapple with Iona. Eddie Donovan's boys overwhelmed the Gaels' soph-studded crew 77-52. Bob Clark paced the Bona attack with 16 points and Larry Weise swished 14.

Playing a sound team game against Fordham's highly-praised sophs, the Bonnies, sparked by McCann's 22 points, clipped the Rams 66-55, to conclude the trip.

Following the successful New York City tour, the Bonnies moved once more to Buffalo's Memorial Auditorium to clash with Georgetown in the opening round of the Queen City Invitational Tournament.

Playing as fine a game as they had against Fordham, the Bonnies handily defeated the outclassed Hoyas, 79-55.

Brendan McCann swished 27 points and hustling Ernie Rokose chipped in with 21 to engineer the Bonnies' crushing fast break.

Two nights later the Bonnies met an underrated Xavier of Ohio quintet led by chunky Dave Piontek and little Jimmy Boothe. The Brown Indians rallied too late and toppled before the tourney champs 95-86.


McCann again took care of the scoring for the Injuns with a 31 point outburst, his high for the season.



Jerry Schlee

Jerry Schlee, a 6 ft. 5 in. senior from Buffalo, N. Y., playing his fourth season of basketball, turned in his finest offensive output of his career by scoring 246 points.

Schlee's high game came against Scranton when he flipped in 20.

It was also in his final season that Schlee, always considered as a tough defensive man, came into his own underneath the boards. He picked off 278 rebounds in 23 games to take team honors.

His career totals are 590 points and 684 rebounds.

Probably the finest game of his career was the night he tallied 20 points against the great Maurice Stokes of St. Francis of Loretto in the Buffalo Memorial Auditorium last season.

St. Bona's 80 LeMoyne 70

Returning to the Olean Armory after the Christmas holidays Bona's Brown Indians entertained one of the best LeMoyne clubs in the history of the Jesuit school. Dick Kenyon, the Dolphins' all-time high scorer, and his scoring shadow Bob Dietz headed a LeMoyne squad that was searching for its first Bona scalp.

But with Ernie Rokose providing the scoring touch, the Bonnies caught fire in the final ten minutes to overrun the Dolphs 80-70 to extend the win streak in the Olean Armory to 59 games.

The Bonnies started out quite slowly, appearing tired, but they never permitted the Dolphs to take the lead. By halftime Bona was ahead 35-25 chiefly through the efforts of Brendan McCann and Jimmy Crough. McCann finished with 19 points and Crough with 18.

But it was Rokose who provided the fireworks as he came on fast in the second half to finish with 19 points.

High man for the game, however, was the visitor's pesky pointmaker Dick Kenyon with 24 points, most from the free throw lane. "Jumping" Johnny McCarthy was the difference between victory and defeat as Canisius pulled a sure Bona win right out from under their noses in a 74:73 thriller in the Buffalo Memorial Auditorium.

In one of the most existing Little Three games in history, a Hank Nowak-less Griff five was out-rebounded and outplayed only to win.

Jerry Schlee and Bob Clark took enough first-half rebounds to feed the hot hands of Ernie Rokose for a 49-39 spread at half-time.

But an inspired Canisius team, with McCarthy leading the way, kept pushing until, with 45 seconds remaining, McCarthy stole the ball to put the Griffs ahead 72-71.




But, following a Canisius timeout, McCarthy took a pass in the corner, jumped, shot and as the ball fell through the nets the final whistle sounded.

Ernie Rokose

Ernie Rokose, a junior from Elizabeth, N. J., was probably the most improved player on the squad this year.

Relegated to reserve roles last season, Rokose became the second leading scorer behind Brendan McCann. He averaged 12.7 points per game.

In the Queen City Tourney Rokose exploded to score 60 points in the three games and was one of the most outstanding players in the tournament.

Possessing great speed and a good eye from anywhere on the court, Rokose was always a scoring threat. A hard driver, the 5 ft. 10 in. junior was at his best in the clutch.

Rokose's best game of the year was his 26 point outburst against a highlyregarded Memphis State quintet in the Buffalo Aud.

St. Bona's 75 Niagara 87

Scorched the previous week by Johnny McCarthy and Canisius' one-point victory, the Bonnies returned to the Buffalo Memorial Auditorium to take on a young and strong Niagara quintet.

After rallying twice early in the contest, the Injuns went down to defeat 87-75.

By the middle of the second half the Eagles had this one well under control as they coasted to victory.

Tom Hemans tallied 25 points for Niagara as soph Jim Maloney's passes and soph Alex Ellis' rebounding kept the Bonnies in a constant dither.

With Brendan McCann as the guiding light, the Brown Indians fought to within one point of the Eagles on four different occasions, only to have Niagara, which never relinquished the lead, surge ahead once again.

Even though the Indians shot 48% from the field for one of their best shooting nights of the year, rebounding told the story as the Eagles doubled Bona's output.

McCann led Bonaventure in scoring once again with 20 points.

Then Schlee and Gerry Olshefski put in jump shots and Rokose countered two Siena free throws with a pair of his own.


Bona was one point behind when Schlee stole the ball from Hill and shoveled it to the driving Rokose for the Bona victory.

Gerry Olshefski

Gerry Olshefski, a 6 ft. 5 in. junior from Wilkes-Barre, Pa., came on fast at the end of the season after working himself into a starting role.

With Jerry Schlee and Bobby Clark settled on the first five, Olshefski saw little action in the first part of the campaign.

But, when he showed the ability to come off the bench cold and score, he was given a starting assignment and then couldn't be dislodged from the first five.

This year Olshefski grabbed 127 rebounds while averaging seven points a game.

The 6 ft. 5 in. junior's best shot is a one-hand jump from just outside the foul circle. From inside he is very dangerous with a right hand hook shot.

St. Bona's 60 Duquesne 70

It seemed like "old times" as the names of Green and Ricketts again spelled defeat for the Brown Indians. Although it was a different Ricketts, Dave not Dick, it was the same deadly Green, and this combination made sure that the outcome was similar to both meetings of the two clubs the previous year as Duquesne won 70-60.

Starting slowly Si Green didn't crack the nets until 16 minutes had slipped but he more than made up for this as the game progressed. With 15 minutes gone Bona was ahead 22-15. Then Green casually uncoiled and five minutes later at halftime the Dukes led 33-26.

Duquesne kept raiding the rims on Dave Ricketts' set shots and raised the margin to 58-40 in the second half.

Then Jimmy Crough and Larry Weise began to bother the Dukes by continually stealing the ball and the lead was sliced to 61-55 with three minutes left.

But Green and Mickey Winograd squelched the rally with five quick points as the game ended.

Crough led all the scorers with 20 points.

Larry Weise

Larry Weise, a six-foot sophomore from East Rochester High has developed tremendously in his first year as a varsityman.

Since breaking into the starting lineup, Weise handled himself like a veteran, dropping in 142 points in 17 games for an 8.3 average per game.

The Rochester soph missed six games when he broke his hand during the Iona game.

Very quick on defense Weise can easily disrupt an opponent's fast break with his pass pilfering.

He is especially dangerous against a zone which he riddles with a soft set.

Weise stands out in the intricate pattern system used by the Bonnies because of his outstanding ballhandling ability.

St. Bona's 79 Memphis S. 67

With Ernie Rokose pacing the attack, the Bonnies smashed a Memphis State high-scoring powerhouse 79-67 before an astonished gathering at Buffalo's Memorial Auditorium.

The Indians put on one of their finest shooting exhibitions in many a moon as they fired at a 55% clip to outoffense the 4th ranking offensive unit in the nation.

Leading 15-2 early in the contest and then 39-23 at the half, the Bonnies showed that the lead was no fluke by opening a 53-29 margin shortly after the second half began.

The Bengals' high-scoring twins, Win Wilfong and Forest Arnold, who had averaged almost 50 points together for 90 ppg Tigers, were held to their lowest total of the year.

Rokose, high for the evening with 26 points, outplayed the Southerners at their own run-and-shoot game as Gerry Olshefski, playing one of his best games of the season, and Brendan McCann bolstered Rokose in the scoring column.

But McCarthy swooshed 11 points in a row to up the gap to 55-41 and then the Griffs fast broke the fading Bonnies to death.


Canisius' five starters all scored in double figures as the Griffs never surrendered an early lead.

The Griffs also found time to yank down twice as many rebounds as the taller Indians.


It was the second straight season in which the Griffins had whipped Bona three times in a row.

In high school Connors won letters in both basketball and baseball and holds the season scoring record in the Syracuse parochial school league.

The Syracusan fires a line drive jump shot and can drive well for his height.

As a Bona frosh he set a Papoose scoring record of 38 points in a single game while leading the team in scoring.

Connors stood out in the season's lidlifter against St. Vincent's when he scored 14 points.

St. Bona's 85 Gannon 65

Gunning for the 62nd straight Brown and White victory in the Olean Armory, five Bonnies crushed double figures and two others had eight points each as Gannon was soundly trounced 85-65.

Hitting well from the floor and rebounding savagely against the height-less Knights the Indians closed their home season in fine style.

Bona, stymied by the fine shooting of Dick Fox and Bob Vilchinski of the Knights, didn't get rolling until the second half.

The Bonnies finally moved out to a comfortable 67-40 margin with ten minutes left and coasted the rest of the way.

Hemans led the Niagara five with 20 points as the Eagles dealt the Bonnies their fourth Little Three defeat of the season.




Brendan McCann led Bona with 20 points.

Because of a lack of experience Durr played with the reserves this season.

St. Bona's 81 LeMoyne 61

After losing to Bona in the comfortable confines of the Olean Armory, LeMoyne's Dolphins were intent on revenging the loss before their home crowd in the Syracuse War Memorial.

But this was stimulus enough for the Indians who crushed the astonished Dolphs 81-61.

The 6 ft. 2 in. O'Dell worked his way into a starting position on the Bona freshman squad after averaging 20 points per game in the Essex County league.

As a frosh O'Dell finished second in scoring to Jack Connors.

He has tremendous spring which enables him to rebound effectively with taller opponents.

He balances a good outside two-hand set with a speedy drive for his points.

Because of inexperience O'Dell saw little action until the final trip of the year.

St. Bona's 76 Sampson 56 Bona's lethal anti-aircraft attack was powerful enough to trip up the Sampson Air Base Sabres twice this season.

In the first game at the Olean Armory Bona won going away by 76-56.

With Brendan McCann combining pinpointed passes with an Annie Oakley shooting eye the Bonnies jumped to a 14-0 lead and were never behind.

The Injuns led at the half 38-20.


BOWLING



BASKETBALL


