# Class History

In June of 1957, all over America, the future plans of the high school graduating classes were many and varied. Quite a few had elected to advance their studies in colleges and universities in every state of our country. A certain percentage of them decided to come to St. Bonaventure University. This is how the class of 1961 came together. Here is a chronicle of the years we spent together at St. Bona's.

About two weeks after we started our college life, the Student Senate gave us a banquet in Hickey Memorial. Most of us felt it was a nice gesture on their part; a gesture designed to welcome us to the University. The fact of the matter was that they were welcoming us to the school, but it meant much more; the Freshman Rules and Regulation Program began in full swing.

Before this banquet we were freshmen at St. Bonaventure University, but now, and for the next six or seven weeks, we learned that there was a large faction here that didn't care for us at all, and they were all sophomores.

Our Freshman year was also the Centennial Year for the University. Among the visitors to the campus were his Eminence Francis Cardinal Spellman and Governor Harriman.

In this year we elected Dave Keefe, President; Mike Kelly, Vice-President; Ted Hyle, Secretary; Charlie Ruth, Treasurer; and Bob Kloster, Corny Ahern and Bob McKeon to the positions of Class Senators.

With the beginning of a new school year, the class found its position completely reversed as regards the social standing on campus. We revelled in hearing the Frosh sound off, making them run errands, shine shoes, check mail, write letters, make signs, make more signs and all the other things traditionally associated with the Rules Program.

Now our dreams were slowly being realized. At long last we were Juniors and upperclassmen. We seemed to be more a part of the University, as next year we would seem to be even a more integral part.

We knew that 1959-60 was to be our year. Bill Ramsay was chosen to be the Prom chairman, and thanks to the year long efforts of Bill and his committee, the 1960 Junior Prom, presented by the Class of '61, was a great success. The Olean Armory was decorated along the line of the Prom theme; "Paris a Nuit." It was here we could and did dance all night to the music of Larry Elgart.

Elected officers were Larry McLernon, President John Kacani, Vice-President; Ernie O'neil, Secretary; and Charlie Ruth, Treasurer; and Mike Kelly, Marty Sweeney, and Larry Higgins as our Senators.

This was the year we saw the University's third straight N.I.T. bid, a bid to the Holiday Festival, and St. Bonaventure's first All-American. Tom Stith received the honor while he maintained 31.5 points per game as a scoring average for the position of second highest scorer in the country.

In the summer before our last year of college, about thirty of us were lucky to get a six weeks, all expenses paid, vacation at Fort Sill, Oklahoma.

Finally we became Seniors. Many of us learned of the tragic death of Michael Linck, a fellow classmate. Mike is no longer a member of our ranks, but he will live on in our prayers.

The class effort of this year was directed toward three major areas; the Fall Festival, the Bonadieu, and Senior Week. Directing the efforts were John Kacani, President; John Sponyoe, Vice-President; Rease Roche, Secretary; and Charlie Ruth, Treasurer. Our Senators were Mike Kelly, Marty Sweeney, Frank Cross, Larry Cross, Larry Higgins and Tom Johnston.

The Fall Festival was another feather in our cap. The general carnival atmosphere was intensified by the Festival games held in a big circus tent at Bishop Walsh High School. That evening there was an excellent buffet dinner in the dining hall, a cocktail party in the clubhouse and to climax the event, a dance in the Olean Armory, featuring the trio of Ahmad Jamal. Sunday the big feature was a jazz concert. All of these individual activities combined to make the Fall Festival one of the fondest memories in our collection.

Thus ends the chronicle of the class of 1961. The chronicle ends here, but the lives of the men and women of the class are just beginning. No matter what field we choose to enter, we will always remember St. Bonaventure University in a valley in the Allegany foothills. We have increased our knowledge and made many friends here, and we will carry away a great storehouse of memories. We will always be here in spirit. Indeed, the spirit of St. Bona's will live forever in our hearts!

Eddie Donovan: more than a coach






Co-captain Whitey Martin led many a fast break over the 1961 season, the Brown Indians' most successful ever. The 6-2 backcourt ace with the tiger-quick reflexes stood out on defense, too, pulling off more "steals" than most bank robbers.

Fellow Co-captain **Tom Stith** pulled a sweet and deadly southpaw hook shot out of his bottomless bag of tricks. The practically indefensible shot was just one more reason the graceful "T" made everybody's All America for the second year in a row.




Tom Fitzmaurice came on strong in the second half of the 1961 season to provide needed strength on the boards. Coming in at crucial moments, Fitz battled the opponents' biggest men under the bucket, but came up with more than his share of rebounds.



Tommy McHugh served as a dependable emergency replacement until he was sidelined by a slipped disc in early February. But the popular senior stayed with the team even then to supply his usual moral support.

Junior **Ed Petrovick** also appeared in many tight spots. Pet's pretty jump shot and spirited board play made him a valuable man to have in reserve.






Big Bob McCully turned into a brawler in 1961 to fill the Brown Indians' deepest need: the big man who could control the boards. Bobby won the starting center berth and held it all season by going up higher and coming down harder than anyone else. And he usually came down with the ball.

**Orrie Jirele** made the perfect backcourt partner for Martin. The 5-11 junior's hustling, harassing defense kept opponents permanently off-balance, and his constant chatter kept teammates operating at top efficiency. Orrie specialized in a "heads up" brand of ball, spotting the slightest enemy lapse and instantly taking advantage of it.



Tom Hannon turned in his customary workmanlike performance over the 1961 season. The Scranton scrapper was used both as a forward and a guard, and filled in capably wherever he was played. Tom's aggressive style made him a respected figure in the jams under the bucket.





Sophomore Mike Joyce often made opponents look foolish. Playing most of his ball in the late minutes, the 6-1 guard's deceptive speed came in handy when backcourt starters were burdened with fouls.



Jumping Jack Ormsby also saw limited duty. Recruited from the I-M league, amiable Jack showed a remarkable ability to outleap much taller men, and appears a bright prospect for future seasons.

When Freddy Crawford drove in for a layup, he usually followed through. Hardworking "Freeze" nailed down a starting berth as a sophomore by displaying a wealth of all-round talent that already has him touted for a future All America. His fantastic ballhandling and sure shooting touch placed him second only to Stith in scoring.










Taking a big step up, the Brown Indians entered their first NCAA tournament in 1961. In the opener at Madison Square Garden, the Bonnies were nearly upset by underdog Rhode Island. Trailing the scrappy Rams at the half, the Bonnies finally took it 86-76, when soph sensation Fred Crawford erupted with 14 points in the final ten minutes.

Far from the friendly sidewalks of New York, the Brown Indians invaded Charlotte, N. C. on St. Patrick's night for the Eastern Regional semi-final. There, they had the misfortune to run into a deafeningly partisan home crowd and a devastatingly fired-up Wake Forest basketball team. In spite of a valiant 29-point effort by Tom Stith, the brokendown Coliseum clock showed the Bonnies on the short end of a 78-73 final score. But the Brown Indians came roaring back the next night, blitzed Princeton with a 54-point second half to take third place. Finishing the season like they started it, they won going away, 85-67.

Undoubtedly the greatest basketball player ever to wear the brown and white of Saint Bonaventure, Co-captain **Tom Stith** closed out his fabulous career by amassing a total of 2052 points, joining the tiny handful of super-stars to exceed two thousand points in a three-year collegiate career. The effortless grace exhibited by the "Tall T" led a few critics to believe he wasn't doing his best, but anyone who ever saw him perform in one of Bona's tough contests knew better. Tom's efforts satisfied one rather capable observer: Coach Eddie Donovan. They also were enough to make him a consensus All-America two years in a row.

In his eighth season at the Bona basketball helm, Coach Eddie Donovan racked up 24 wins against only 4 losses. Despite two disappointments, the spoilers by Niagara and Wake Forest, 1960-61 went down in the record books as the Bonnies' best season on the hardwood. In the national polls the Brown Indians stood near the top from the time the season began until it ended. But win or lose, Coach Donovan's team was always a pleasure to watch. Both the fast-paced, exciting brand of ball and the sportsmanlike way in which it was played can be credited to Eddie Donovan, every Bonaman's Coach of the Year.
