

make it easier to recall them.




Professor James I. Henderson

During the Fall of 1966, the St. Bonaventure Soccer team, playing what was by far the most difficult schedule in their history, compiled a very impressive record, not only in the win loss column but also in individual and team records.

Twelve men started playing soccer for Coach Skehan four years ago, when soccer was considered little more than an intramural sport. This year these same men came back as seniors, and provided the backbone for the first soccer team at Bonas ever to have better than a .500 season.

In the first game of the season against arch rival Canisius on their home field, an all senior team completely outclassed the inexperienced Griffin squad. In the 6-0 rout, John Broomfield and John Hoffmaster had two goals apiece, while John Hogan and Tom Crist each tallied one. In this contest, the first varsity game between the two schools ever competed on a Canisius field, the Bonaventure spirit was evidenced by the overwhelming number of Bona fans present who outnumbered the Canisius fans considerably.

Ithaca College, NCAA semi-finalists of the year before, complete with All-American Janos Benedek invaded Bonaventure on October 1, expecting what in previous years had been a breather in their schedule. Not only was Ithaca surprised at the Bonnies skill and hustle, but as it turned out, their breather almost became a dying gasp. The scoring for the Bonnies was done by Tom Crist on a perfectly placed, difficult left footed shot; Art Jasper on one of his patented sinking shots from the corner and John Newman, a very promising sophomore, from squarely in front of the goal. These three goals made Bonaventure the first team in three years to score more than twice against Ithaca. However, Benedek was too much to contain, scoring two goals and making the assist on the other two. Although the 4-3 loss was a real heartbreaker it had to be considered a moral victory and definitely showed promise of a good brand of soccer for future games.

The next week the Bona Booters traveled to Big Ten Country where they met powerhouse Ohio State, who had finished second in the Conference the year before. This game however was never meant to be a victory for the Bonnies, who perhaps a little awed by their surroundings played a very sluggish game and finished on the wrong end of a 3-0 score.

In a night game at Bradner Stadium, Bonaventure lost a hard fought battle to Buffalo State. Given a boost by goalie Larry Grassini's block of a Buff State penalty kick at the end of the first half, the Bonnies came on strong and Tony Fien put one in with just three minutes gone in the third quarter. It looked like Buffalo was on the run but two Bona defensive lapses in the fourth quarter made it 2-1 Buffalo State, and ruined the Bonnies chances to even up their record at this time.

Before a Homecoming Day crowd of 1,000 Bonaventure got back to its winning ways by defeating the University of Rochester. Never having beaten Rochester before, the hungry Bonaventure eleven came out on top of a defensive battle, 2-0. Artie Jasper, playing an outstanding game, assisted in both goals, setting up Crist and Newman for the scores. Captain Larry Grassini was named Most Valuable Player and was awarded a trophy by the Homecoming Queen, Miss Mary Anne Wilhelm.

On October 19, the varsity played host to Alfred University, and avenged the previous year's defeat. Bonas couldn't seem to get started, and Alfred scored first, late in the first quarter. Pete Bonanno, a speedy sophomore wing put in the first of his three goals early in the second quarter, but Alfred refused to be outdone and scored again to put them one up at the half. Alfred scored its third goal early in the third quarter and things started to look dim for the Bonnies. With two

minutes to go in the third period Johnny Hogan put in a perfectly placed shot that brought Bonaventure back into contention. In the fourth quarter it was all Jasper to Bonanno as the rookie put two beautiful shots in the corner after "Old Man Artie" placed the ball right on his foot. That made it 4-3 Bonas and that was the way it ended as the Indians played one of the strongest offensive games of the season.

Denis Tarpey, Bill Lilly, Al Cervi and Larry Grassini were Fredonia State's downfall as the stalwart Bonaventure defense refused to be penetrated and in doing so registered their third shutout of the season. Coming in off the bench, Tom Fassanella proved to be the hero of the game as he booted in the first goal of his career late in the third quarter. This was the only score of the game, and the Bonnies, having won their last three games were now four and three on the season.

Slippery Rock completely destroyed Skehan's charges with a 5-1 bombing on the Pennsylvanian's home grounds. Slippery Rock's fast break offense, coupled with their use of the platoon system of substitution ran the tired Bona defense ragged, while the Indian front line just couldn't seem to click. John Hogan scored the lone goal for Bonaventure, but it was a fruitless effort.

Bouncing back against traditional power house, Bucknell, the Bona Booters evened up their record by defeating the Ivy Leaguers 3-1. Led by half-back Tony Fien, who scored two goals, the Bonnies completely out hustled Bucknell and managed to keep the ball in their territory throughout the whole game. Johnny Hogan scored the other goal for Bonaventure, as Fien, Tom Crist and John Broomfield played an outstanding halfback game, coming back to help the defense and still managing to set up the offense.

Bonaventure traveled out to Pennsylvania to meet Susquehanna University for the season finale on November 1. Susquehanna looked tough as they took the ball and drove into the Bonnie goal with only forty nine seconds elapsed in the game. But Bonaventure, seeking its sixth win came back strong and won 4-2. Pete Bonanno ran circles around his man and scored two, while Artie Jasper and Tony Fien each contributed one to the success.






Traveling out to Slippery Rock, the varsity avenged last year's defeat by swamping the Pennsylvanians 71-33.


It seemed as if the Bonnies would never lose as they bested Buffalo State 64-26.






CAPTAIN GEORGE CARTER








PAUL STAPPENBECK


JEFF HAZARD




FRANK SATALIN


RAY WALSH


