Club football managed only a 1-6 won-loss record in 1969, but the mere fact that the team continued to function as a whole for the entire seven-game schedule to offset the poor showing on the gridiron. Once again the familiar problems of scheduling, finances, poor crowds and little student interest plagued Coach Matt Conte and his team.

The Bonnies opened their season with four straight losses at the hands of Scranton University, Niagara University, Canisius College and Siena College. They rebounded to take a 13-12 squeaker from RIT before closing out their season with losses to Detroit University and Duquesne University.

In its sophomore year, the club football squad faced a repeat of the problems that had beset it a year earlier. Five of the seven games on the schedule had to be played on the road to take advantage of the financial stipend the team received as visitors. Lack of funds because of reduced contributions and interest also hindered progress, forcing the squad to resort to a number of fundraising programs to gain the necessary resources to continue.

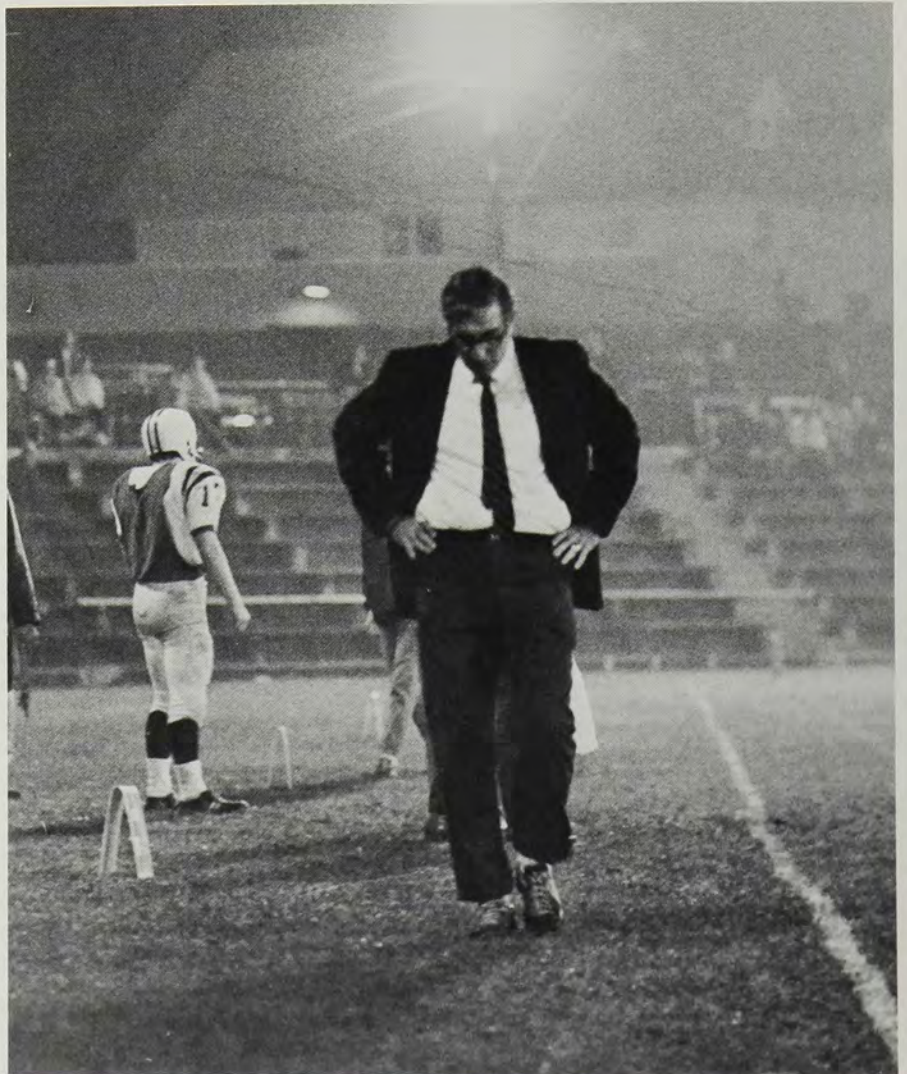
Poor crowds meant poor gate receipts that also hurt the team financially. For the home game with Niagara in Bradner Stadium, only 350 spectators turned out.

Coach Conte hopes for an improved situation in all respects next season, and renewed student interest and support from incoming freshmen. He has stated repeatedly that club football has a future at St. Bonaventure, but it must be given a chance.

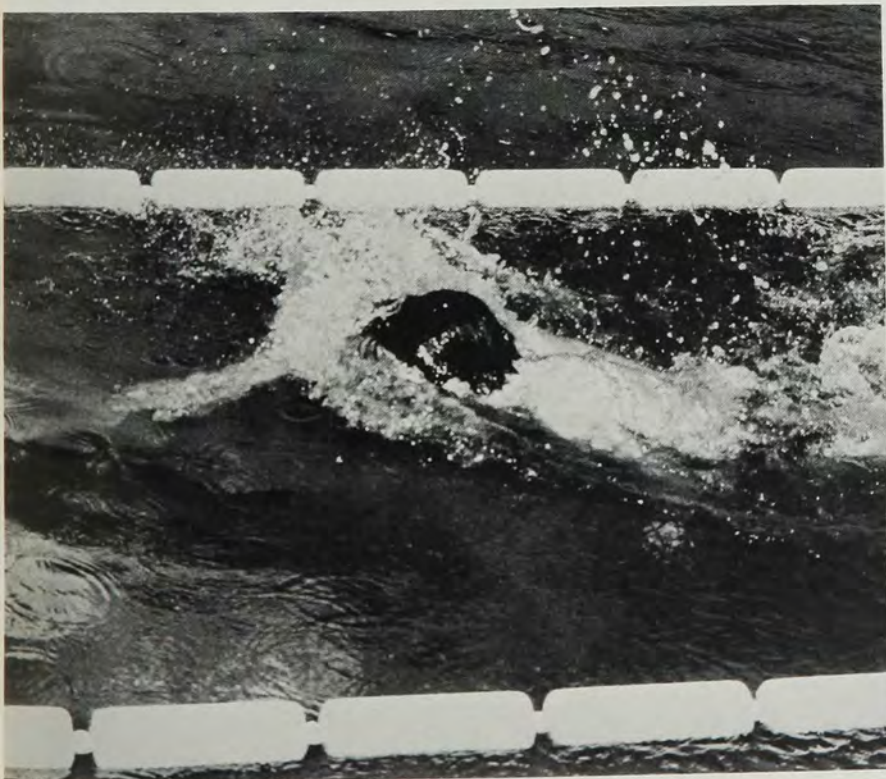
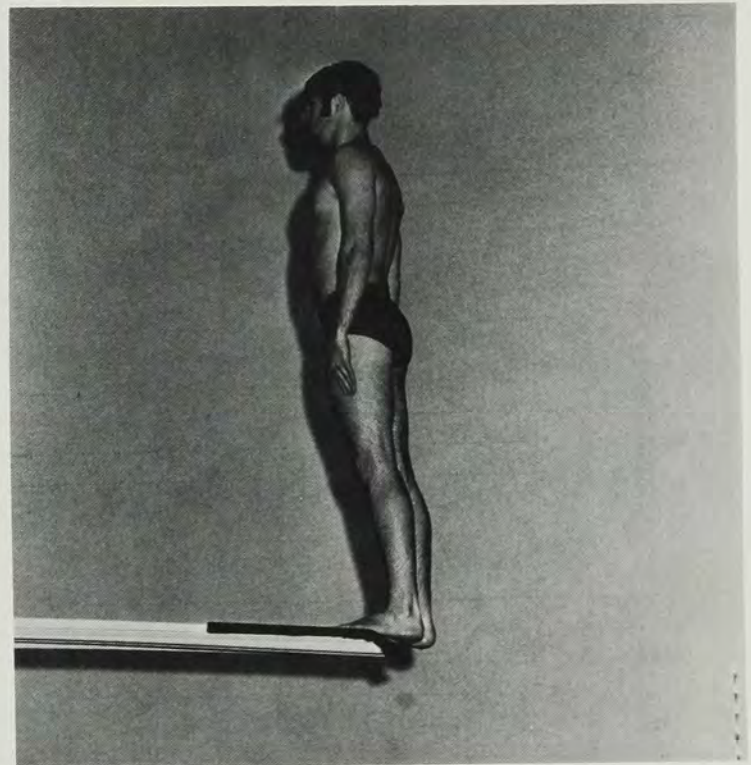
The mermen of Coach John Skehan completed a successful 10-6 season highlighted by many fine individual performances from the frosh-dominated team.

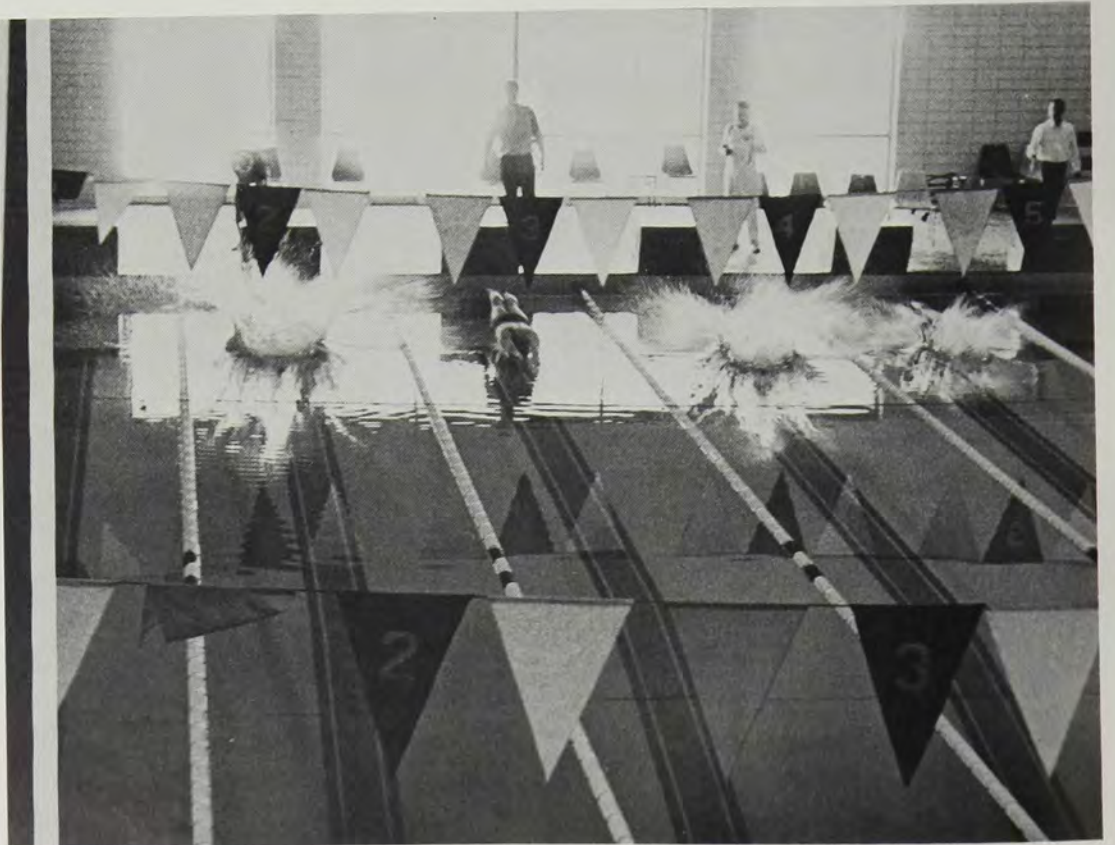
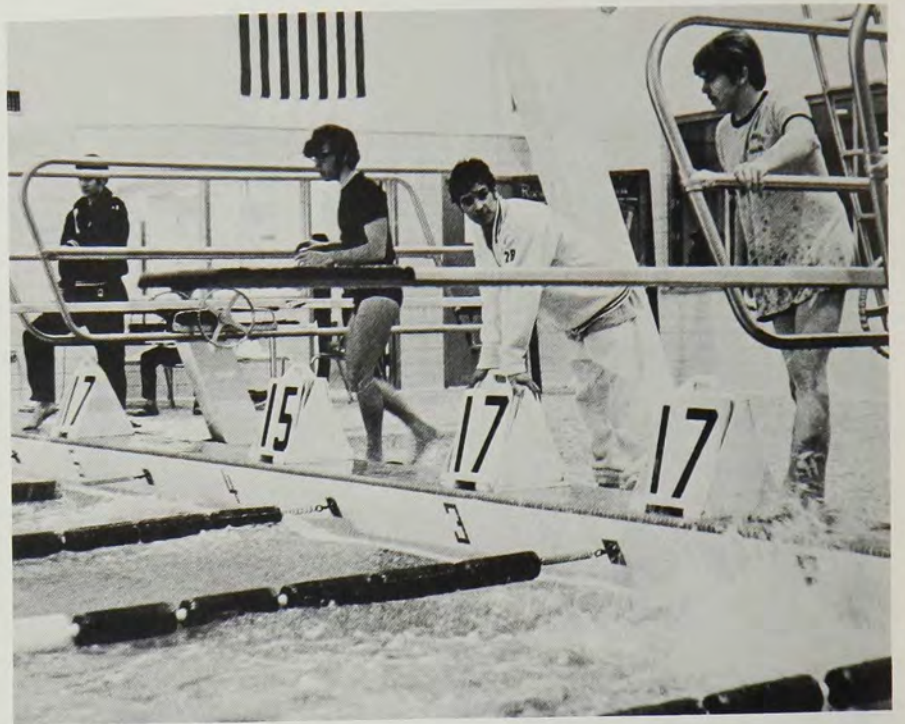
Rich Bohan, a freshman, set a varsity record of 2:22.7 in the 200-yd. breaststroke, breaking it later in the season with a time of 2:20.7. He also broke the record for the 1,000-yd. freestyle with an 11:11.8 effort.

Captain Mike Piedmont swam a record :50 in the 100-yd. freestyle, and was a consistent point winner. Jack Germann set a new diving mark with 263.05 points from a 3-meter board.

The 400-yd. freestyle medley team of Piedmont, Glenn, Lutterbein and Martin broke the record for that event three times, finishing with a 3:24.7 clocking.

At the state championships, the team finished third. Piedmont won the 200-yd. freestyle for the fourth consecutive year, a state record. Bohan won the 200-yd. breaststroke and finished second in the 100-yd. breaststroke, ending up second in the individual scoring, one-half point behind the leaders.

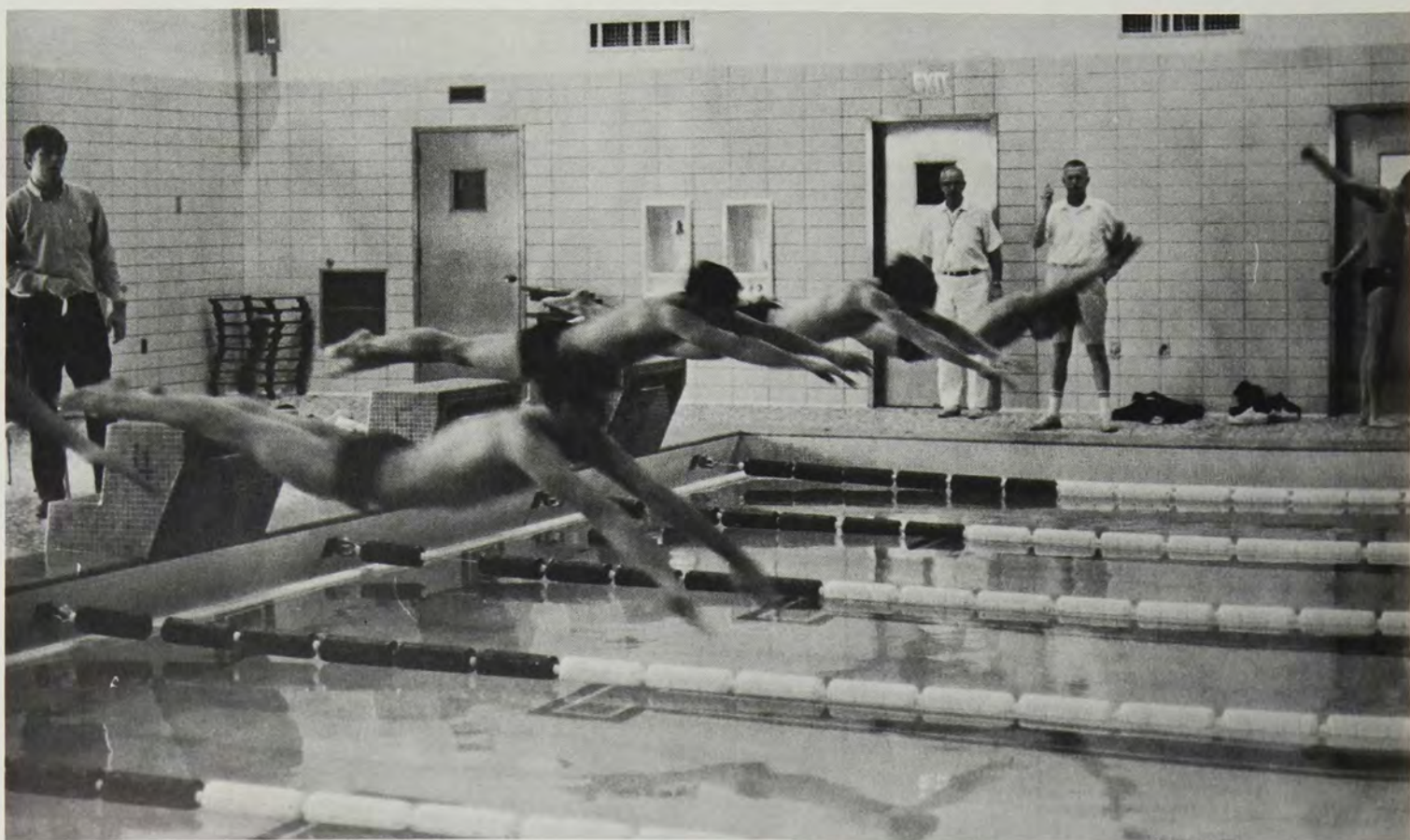
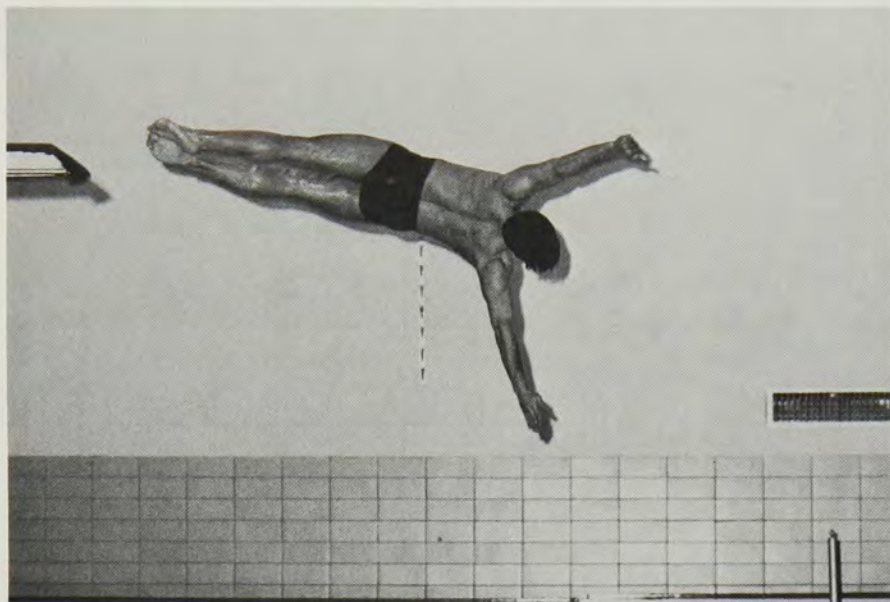

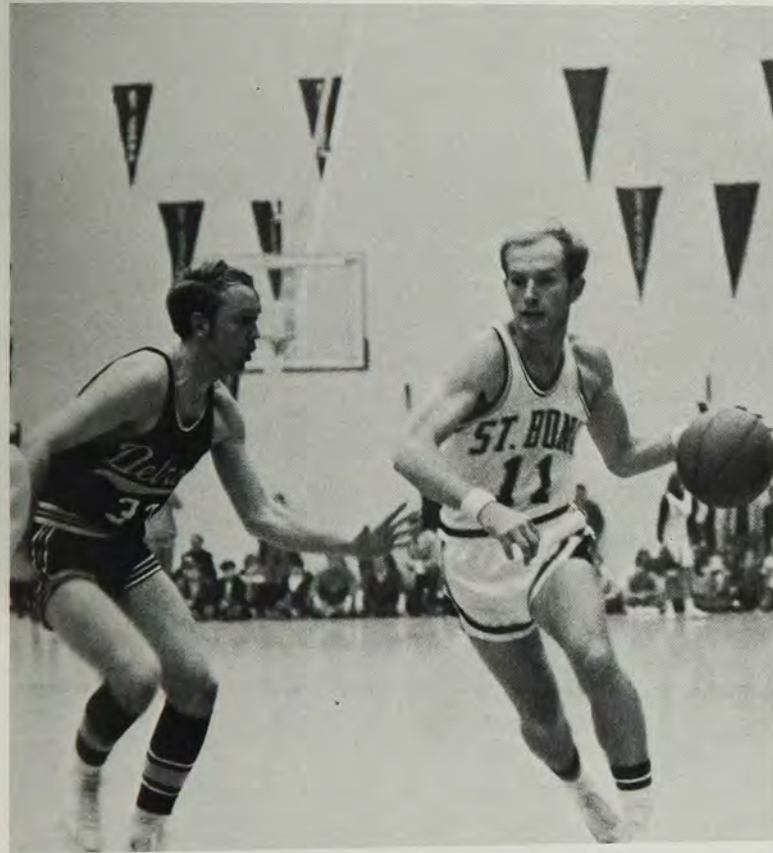


It started long before the first scrimmage or the first game—it started with the first practice session on October 15.

It was confidence, so real you could see it oozing from each player laughing and joking as he worked out. It would be the best team ever, surpassing the height, ability and depth of the Cinderella team two years earlier.

Coach Weise held his breath those first weeks; he wouldn't talk about the possibility of injury, he didn't want to stir the hidden demon to life.

But the students and fans were confident, also; they knew this was potentially the best Bona team. It was also the end of an era, the last chance for two players to avenge something in Red Clay country and go all the way. It was the team's last chance, also. There would be no replacement for Lanier in the future. This was it.





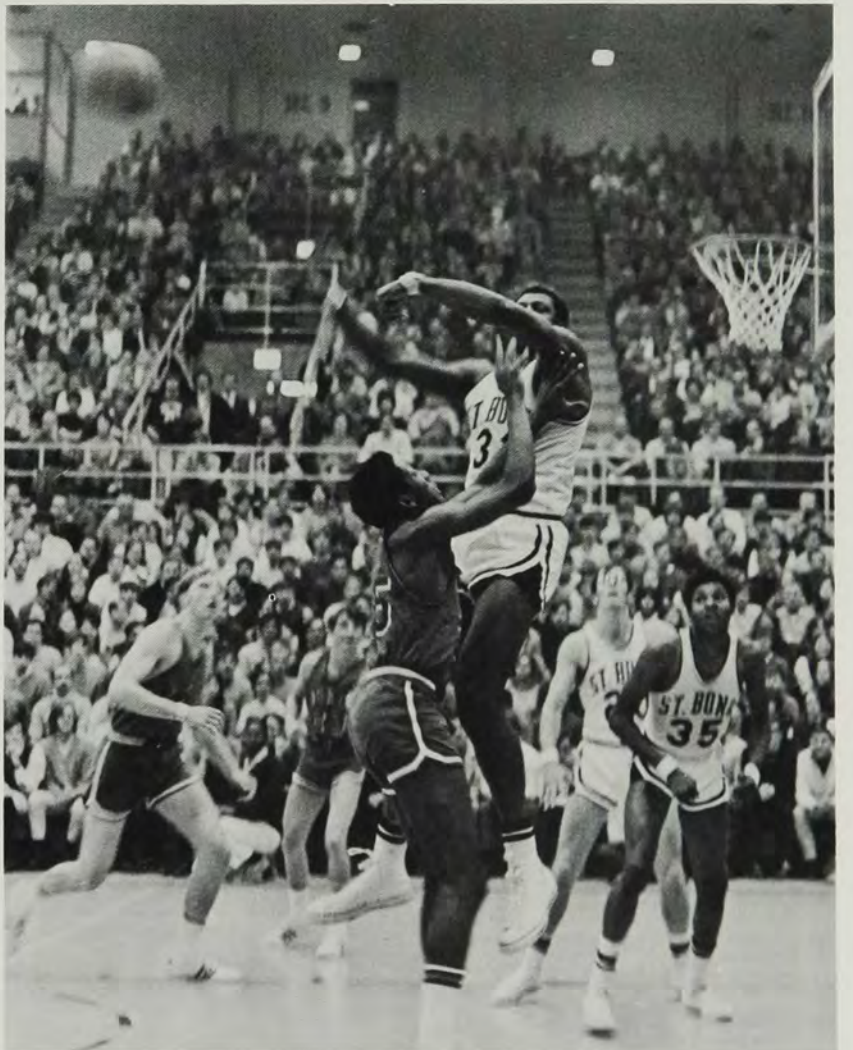
Duquesne was to be the first real test, but the team first avenged a Motor City nightmare from the year before. It might have been a better game if Spencer Haywood, Detroit University's All-American, hadn't jumped to the ABA. The Lanier-Haywood rematch never developed, but the other Detroit veterans could only watch in frustration as the Bonnies racked up a 29-point win.

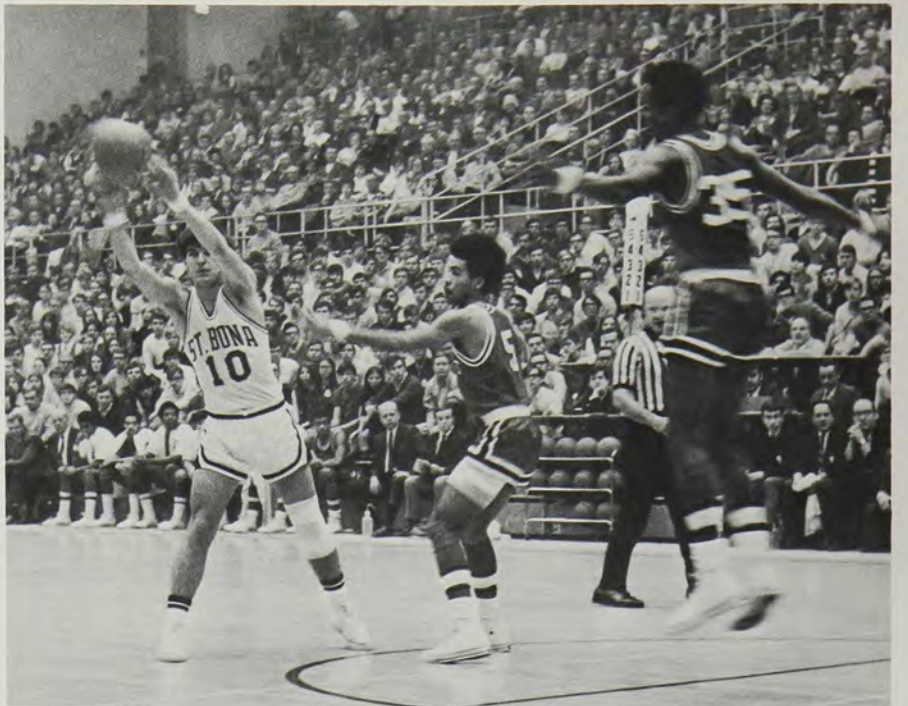
But the big one was five nights later—Duquesne. Christmas vacation began after the last classes that morning, but few students left campus. A record crowd of 6,291 squirmed, sweated, screamed and cursed for two hours before game-time in the sore-back bleachers—the only place to really enjoy a Bona home game. They exploded when the team emerged from the lockers. Minutes later, the Bonnies did, too.

The game was supposed to be a toss-up. Sixth-ranked Duquesne was taller than the Brown Indians and averaging 95 points a game. The Soul Patrol—Lanier, Gantt and Gary—made up for their height deficit, blocking 16 shots and causing 13 Iron Duke turnovers. The 77-58 win heightened the suspense of the upcoming Holiday Festival.

NYU and St. Joseph's fell before the Bona onslaught, heralding the championship test against the Purdue Boilermakers. Purdue had Rick Mount and Bona had Bob Lanier. It should have been a closer contest.







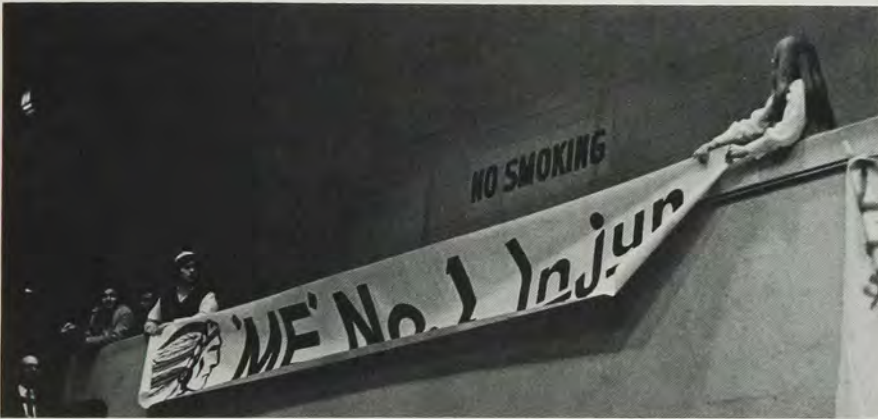


New York City bookmakers favored the Bonnies by four points over the Boilermakers. Someone should have told Ken Frankline, Purdue's center, who said about Lanier: "So they call him the Big Cat, eh? Well, he's gonna find out what happens when he meets a Big Dog!"

Everyone found out. The Big Cat had claws. Lanier humiliated Frankline with a variety of moves, offensive and defensive. He tied the Festival scoring record of 50 points that night, and shares it with Oscar Robertson and Jimmy Walker. Lanier was also named the tourney's MVP. As the Madison Square Garden fans gave him a standing ovation, he broke out in a wide grin: the Bonnies were moving. The next wire service polls ranked the Brown Indians fifth in the nation.

The bubble burst when the Bonnies were 12-0. Villanova coach Jack Kraft engineered the 64-62 upset with two things: a tightly-run ball club that made few mistakes and a distinct home court advantage in the 3,000-seat sweatbox that passes as the Villanova fieldhouse.

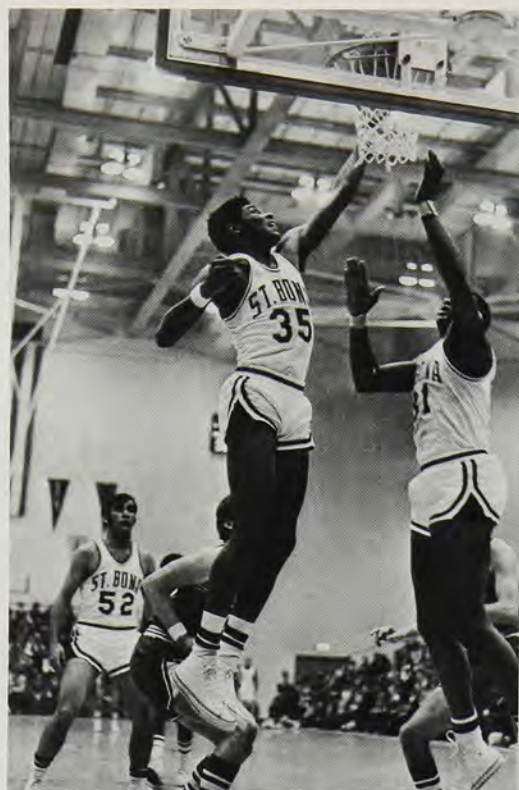
Down by 10 points with only a few minutes left, the Bonnies rallied with eight straight points. A chance to tie the game in the final seconds never materialized as Kalbaugh's layup shot was knocked away by a Wildcat player, a seemingly obvious goal-tending violation. No foul was called, however, and the Bonnies were defeated. A rematch with Villanova in the NCAA tourney became the focal point for the rest of the season.



Four days later the Bonnies showed a maturity lacking the year before when they had tried a similar comeback but had played halfheartedly in a loss to Providence. This time it was a rousing, come-from-behind victory over Niagara in the field-house despite a brilliant performance by the Purple Eagles' Calvin Murphy.

With the Bonnies trailing by 10 points midway through the last half, an irate Larry Weise called a time-out and tongue-lashed the Brown Indians. It lit the fire, and for the rest of the game the Indians went on the warpath, playing the fine caliber of basketball they were capable of.

Lanier took charge of the backboards. Gary hounded the Niagara forwards, forcing them to hurry their shots. Kalbaugh and Hoffman concentrated on Murphy, shutting off his outside shooting. When Murphy did manage to penetrate the Bona defense, Gantt soared into the air three times to stuff his shot, leaving the little All-American staring at the bottom of Matt's sneakers.



The final score was 89-81 in the Brown Indians' favor. That was as close as Niagara came to ending the Bonnies' domination of the Little Three. Another attempt three weeks later in the Buffalo Aud failed miserably. Lanier & Co. toyed with Murphy and the Eagles before demolishing them, 104-68.

Canisius could not even come close to an upset, losing by scores of 62-49 and 91-68. It was the fifth straight Little Three title for St. Bonaventure, and the 15th win in a row over Niagara. Against the Golden Griffins of Canisius, the Bonnies owned a string of 10 straight victories.

The Bonnies finished their season with a win over Fairfield and a 22-1 record. They were ranked third in the nation in the wire service polls. Individual honors once again were accorded Bob Lanier as he was a consensus All-American, making the first five on every All-American team. His teammate and co-captain, Bill Kalbaugh, also was named to an All-America team for players under 5'10".

A long-awaited phone call from the NCAA tournament committee came on February 24, and the Bonnies were off to St. John's to meet the Wildcats of Davidson in their initial 1970 NCAA clash.







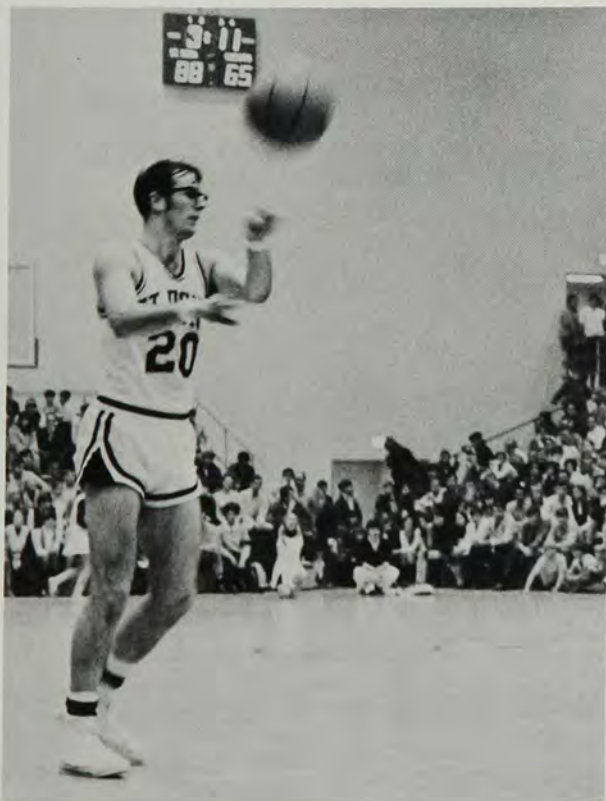

It was another battle of the All-Americans: Bob Lanier vs. Mike Malloy. Lanier won the individual battle and the Bonnies won the game, although it took some last-quarter sharpshooting by Bill Kalbaugh to insure the win.

The team and its contingent of fans moved to Columbia, S.C. and defeated North Carolina State, 80-68, setting the stage for the long-awaited rematch with Villanova. The vengeful Bonnies wreaked havoc upon the basketball machine that Jack Kraft had fashioned, but paid a terrible price for their victory.

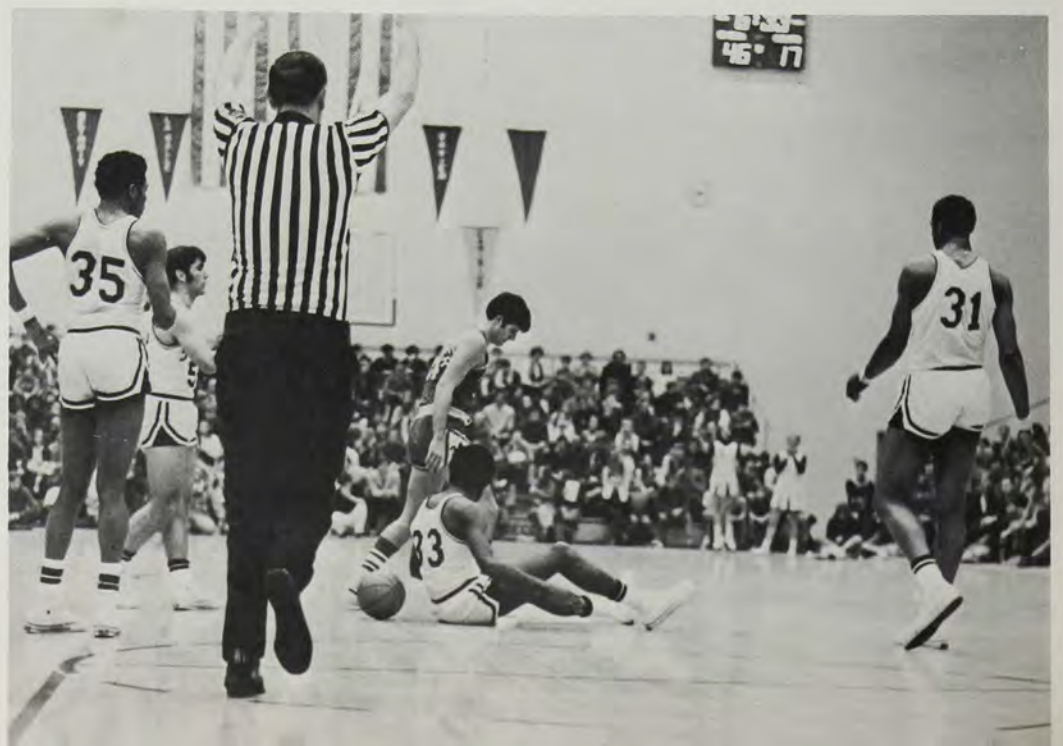
Bob Lanier was hit by a Villanova player and suffered torn ligaments in his knee, exiling him from further play as he finished a sparkling collegiate career wincing with pain on the floor of a southern fieldhouse. The Bonnies carried on, however, as Matt Gantt grabbed 18 rebounds to lead the 97-74 win.



Without their star center, the Bonnies weren't supposed to be any match for Jacksonville, their next opponent. But the Brown Indians battled them almost even, relying on speed, ability, and above all, pride. Gantt and Gary challenged the Jacksonville trio of 7-footers effectively before the height disadvantage forced them out on fouls. Vic Thomas came off the bench to score 15 points and continue the tough defense of the starting five.

The height mismatch and sub-par officiating teamed up to hand the Bonnies their second defeat, 91-83. Yet the team won the admiration of all those who saw them play against such lopsided odds.

In the consolation game of the NCAA semi-finals, the Brown Indians again lost to a much taller team, New Mexico State. But once more it was a close game, with Gary starring for the Bonnies with his scoring and rebounding. The final score was 79-73, as New Mexico State was lucky to eke out the 6-point win.

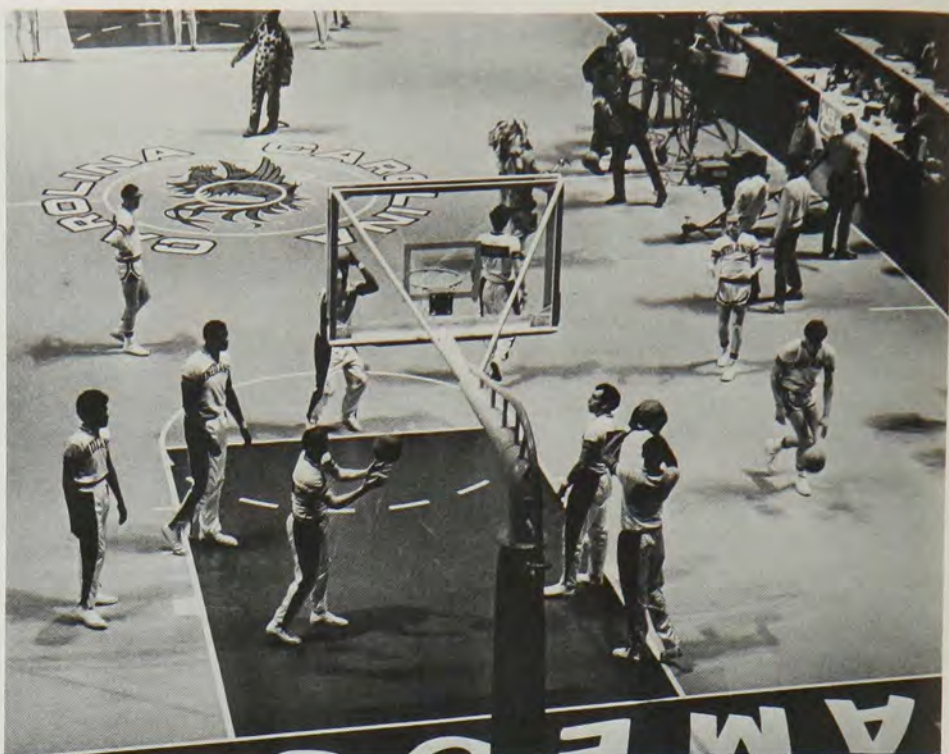

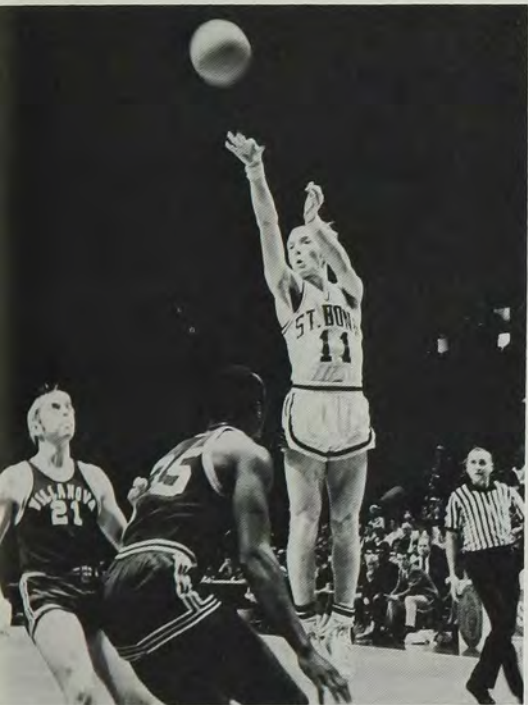

UCLA is the national champion once again, and the Bonnies finished fourth. But when talk of basketball shifts to the 1970 NCAA tourney, it will revolve around the Bonnies—a little-heralded team that came to play despite setbacks, and won the hearts of fans across the nation.





For Coach Larry Weise, his ninth year at St. Bonaventure has been his best. Besides winning the prestigious Holiday Festival, his team this year went to the semi-finals of the NCAA tournament, farther than any Bona team had gone before.

Weise now ranks at the top of Bona basketball coaches with a record of 152-63, having surpassed Eddie Donovan this season.

During his coaching tenure, Coach Weise has taken his teams to two Quaker City tourneys, two Holiday Festivals, the All-College tourney, the National Catholic Invitation, the Motor City Classic, the Blue Grass tourney, the Tampa Invitational, one NIT and two NCAA tournaments. They won the Blue Grass and Tampa tourneys and this year they walked off with the top Christmas tournament prize: the Holiday Festival crown.

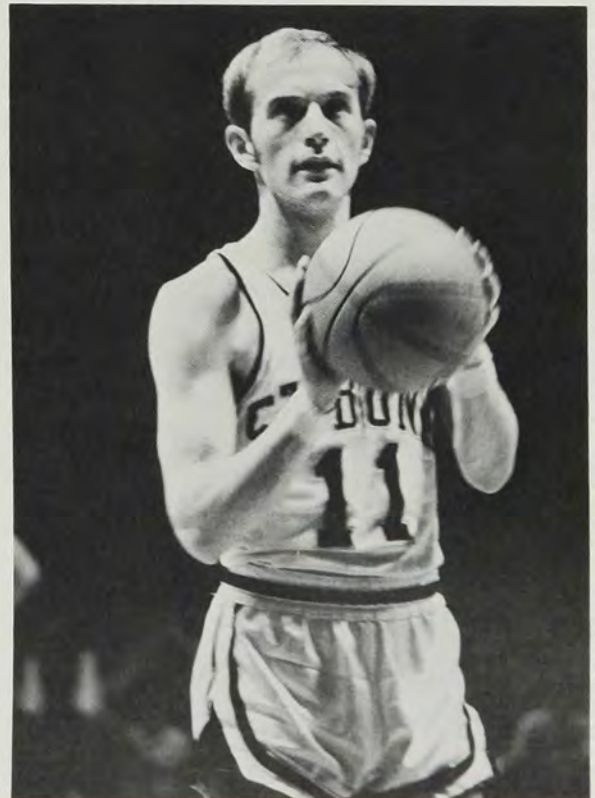




For St. Bonaventure, the graduation of Bob Lanier and Billy Kalbaugh will mark the passing of an era, a time of top-flight basketball.

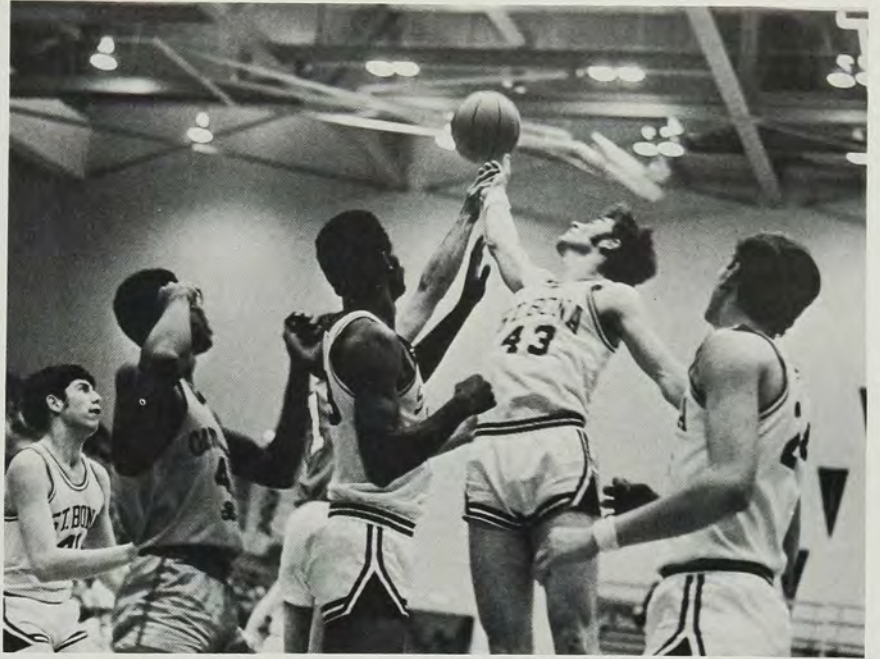
They will separate now—Billy to a teacher's job and Bob to the pro leagues. They will carry with them, however, the thanks and best wishes of Bona fans everywhere.

An undefeated season, a Little Three championship, and a high finish in the ECAC tournament marked the high spot for this year's golf team.

Under the coaching of Prof. Leo Keenan, the team won all eleven matches. The team was led by Dan Malarney, Paul Iaconis and John McKeon, who was the only undefeated golfer for the Bonnies this season.

The Bonnies won the Little Three championship for the fourth season in a row, totaling 74¹/₂ points to 45 for Canisius and 42 for Niagara.

In October, five members of the team—Zakia, Butmon, Iaconis, McKeon and Malarney—played in the ECAC Regional Qualifier at Colgate University. Iaconis, Zakia and Malarney qualified to compete as medal players (individuals) in the finals.

In the finals at Bethpage, L.I., the Bonnies finished fifth, the best finish ever for a Bonaventure golf team in ECAC competition. The Bonnies faced stiff competition as they finished behind Princeton, Penn State, Pittsburgh and Yale.

Also at the ECAC finals, Dan Malarney tied for the runner-up slot in individual play with a total of 77—the best individual performance by a Bonaventure golfer.

The St. Bonaventure cross country team compiled a dual meet record of 6 wins and 6 losses, as well as participating in three invitational runs.

Led by co-captains Dave Ort and Jim Maley, the Bona thinclads opened their season with three straight wins before losing to Geneseo State. A win over St. John Fisher preceded a string of three losses before the Bonnies entered into Little Three competition. A meet with Houghton concluded the team's dual meet slate.

In invitational competition, the Bonnies took third place in the Lemoyne Invitational in a field of nine teams. The team also competed in the Canisius Invitational and ended their season by taking the team trophy with a first-place finish in the JFK Memorial Run. The Bonnies also finished second to Niagara in the Little Three meet.

Dave Ort was the top runner for the Bonnies all year, and also set the SBU course record of 23:11. Jim Maley was the No. 2 runner for the team, and good support came from lettermen John Vacanti, Rich Rattan and John Sulzman.

Made up largely of freshmen and sophomores, inexperience on the team may have prevented a better showing. Yet for Coach George Colfer, it also means a ready supply of veteran runners for future teams.

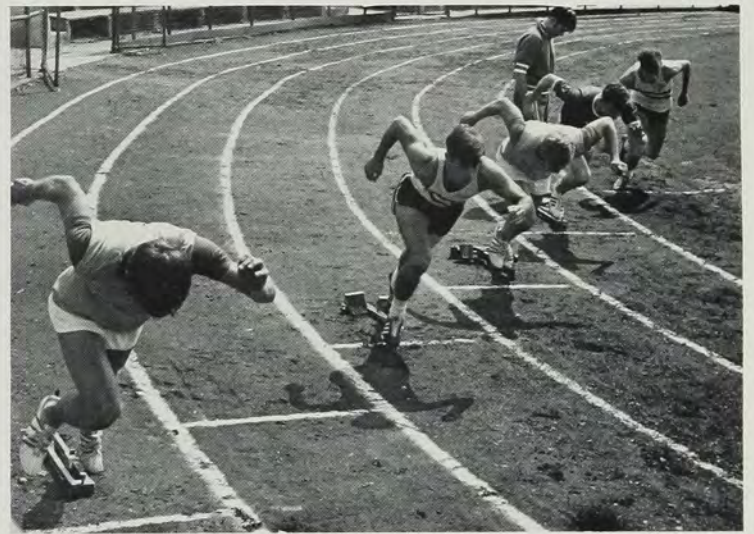

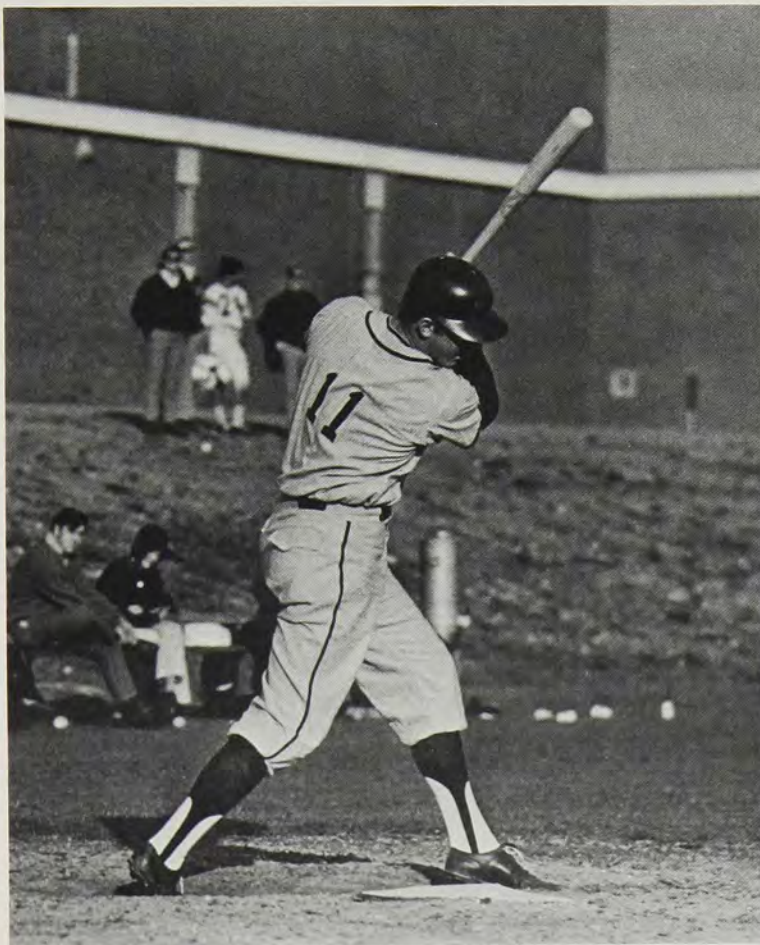

Kevin Leavay was the top pitcher for St. Bonaventure with a 3-0 mound record. He was followed by Ed Saroney and John Kelly.

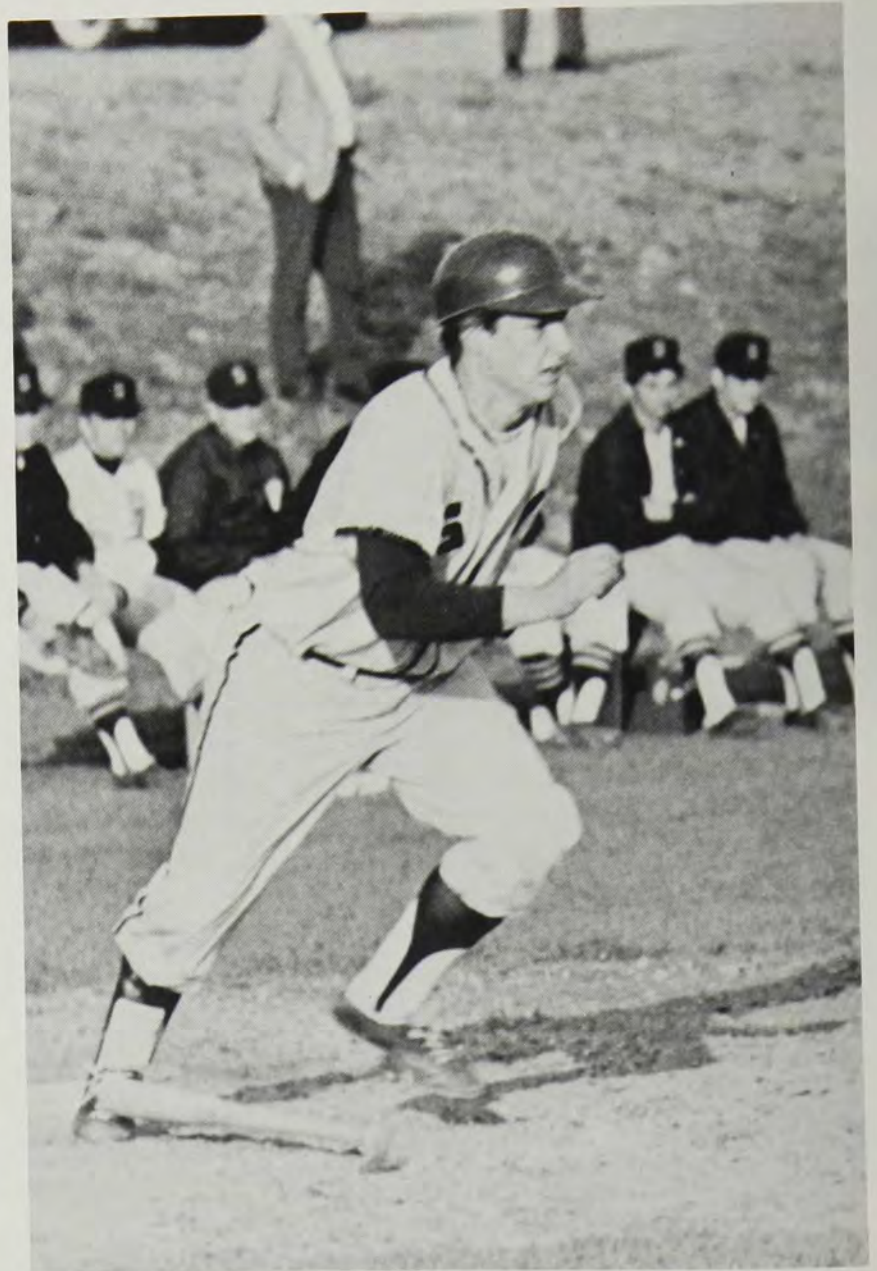

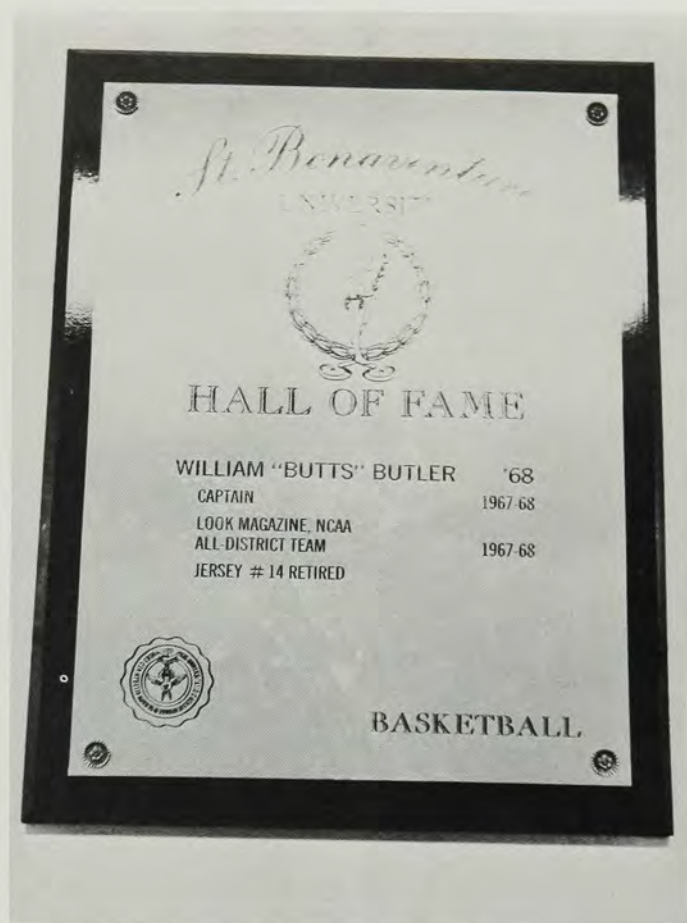
HALL OF FAME
