
Bonaventure become your home away from home, they are the people you will hopefully keep in touch with always.






Counting Down















Men's Soccer

The Y2K phenomenon was only supposed to affect computers, but somehow it worked its way onto the soccer field.

Aspirations were high for the 2000-2001 St. Bonaventure men's soccer team this year after coming off its best season in recent memory. Last year's squad set a school record with eight Atlantic 10 wins and earned its first-ever berth in the A-10 Tournament. However, a mixture of inexperience and injuries hurt the Bonnies this season as the team finished 6-12 overall and 4-6 in the conference.

"It is always disappointing to finish with a losing record," said second-year head coach Bill Brady. "Being an optimist, I believe we played attractive soccer this year but were unable to avoid big mistakes."

After stumbling through a tough non-conference schedule that included games against Penn State and Vermont, the Bonnies looked primed to make a return to the A-10 Tournament. Bona won an overtime thriller

against Duquesne, 1-0, to start the conference season and back-to-back games against Colgate and Canisius leading up to the bulk of its A-10 schedule.

Unfortunately, Bona's first weekend of conference games came on the road against Massachusetts and Rhode Island. The Bonnies dropped a 2-1, overtime battle with UMass and fell to #18 Rhode Island, 2-0. The weekend was the beginning of a five-game conference skid during which the Bonnies lost to Dayton, Xavier and Fordham, and effectively knocked them out of A-10 contention.

To the team's credit, they didn't roll over and die; the Bonnies won their next three A-10 games. They downed La Salle (3-2) and George Washington (2-1) at home and St. Joseph's (2-0) on the road before bowing to Temple in the final game of the season.

Senior captain Sean Kelty led the team in scoring with three goals and six assists for the year. He recorded three games with at least one goal and one assist and was an integral part of the Bonnies' offensive attack. For his efforts, Kelty was named to the A-10 All-Conference second team at the end of the season.

"I feel the worst for Sean because of how much he has put into this program over his four years," said Brady. "I know he would have liked to gone out on a winning team, but his hard work and dedication have set the bar high for the entire program." Joining Kelty with second-team honors was first-year midfielder Geron

DuPorte. The sophomore from Ontario finished third on the team in scoring with four goals and two assists in 16 games. DuPorte was also selected to the A-10 All-Rookie Team along with teammate Said Ali. Ali, another native of Ontario, played in 17 games and finished with two goals and five assists. He was also named A-10 Co-Rookie of the Week for the week ending Oct. 8.

Though not recognized by the conference for their play, sophomore Johnny Phoumanny and junior Anthony Battaglia were large contributors in the Bonnies' offense. Phoumanny led the team with five goals on the year and also recorded an assist. Battaglia scored his three goals in A-10 games and recorded three assists on the year. He also proved to be a clutch scorer, as two of his goals were game-winners. Though the Bonnies weren't able to repeat the success they attained last

year, their tough play at the end of this season hints that better days are ahead. The team will lose only one senior and will return a solid and more experienced core of players.

"We have to be excited for next year because all our young players gained valuable playing experience this year," said Brady. "I believe in our returning guys and I'm confident we can return to the top of the Atlantic 10."


Brady will be sure to work out all the bugs during the offseason, making sure that this year's Y2K problems don't disrupt future Bona soccer seasons.



The 2000-2001 golf season was a year of rebuilding for the Bonnies men.



In addition, there seem to be some good freshman prospects. With these new players and a more experienced returning team things look better for next year. -Jen Rice










Spiashing into a new season

Men's Swimming and Diving

After finishing 4-4 in the dual meet season, the men's swimming and diving team hoped to make amends at the 2001 Verizon/ Atlantic 10 Championship. But while the Bonnies had enough to top six conference foes, they finished a distant second to a talented Massachusetts squad.

"Finishing second is acceptable for this season," said head coach Sean McNamee. "UMass had a very strong team this year, but this needs to sit as motivation for next year's team."

The Bonnies swam well during the three-day meet, but the Minutemen always seemed to be a stroke ahead. Bona didn't place higher than UMass in any swimming event.

Sophomore Borut Poje came the closest to giving the Bonnies a win. Last year's most outstanding rookie performer, Poje missed gold in the 200-yard butterfly by 0.12 seconds. Senior Kyle VanDenBerghe placed third in both the 100 and 200 breaststroke while senior Joe Price picked up the bronze in the 400 individual medley.

Junior Ernest Teo, who led the team with 14 individual wins this season, placed third in the 50 freestyle and played a major role on the relay squads. He helped the 200 medley and 400 free relay teams to silver medals and powered the 200 free and 400 medley relay teams to bronze.

Senior Jim Frisbie had career-best finishes in the diving competitions. He took bronze in the three-meter event and fourth in the one-meter, and his score in the former qualified him for the NCAA Zone A Diving Championship.

Overall, nearly every Bona swimmer recorded a season-best time at the championships, and freshman diver Randy Kozlowski—in addition to notching a team-high four wins during the season—made the final rounds of both the one and three-meter competitions.

"We have the talent and motivation to take back what UMass took away from us this year," said McNamee of the future. "Our responsibility will be to challenge them next year and prove that the title belongs at St. Bonaventure."

Women's Swimming and Diving

Lack of depth haunts team all season

As hard as they tried, the St. Bonaventure women's swimming and diving team couldn't overcome the lack of depth that had haunted them all season. As a result, the Bonnies finished 4-4 in the dual meet and placed third at the 2001 Verizon/

Atlantic 10 Championship behind Massachusetts and George Washington.

With a squad of only 10 swimmers, Bona swam well enough to compete with the Minutewomen and Colonials. During the second day of competition, the Bonnies pulled into second place but just couldn't keep up the pace to stay there.

"When you consider we were going against teams with 18 swimmers, our performance is something to be proud of," said second-year head coach Lance Brennan, who was named A-10 Women's Coach of the Year for his efforts. "Our work ethic prior to the meet was what helped us succeed."

Juniors Katie Czech and Kelley Northup powered the Bonnies throughout the three-day competition. Czech won her first-ever A-10 individual title in the 400-yard individual medley. She also picked up silver and bronze in the 200 IM and 200 butterfly, respectively. Northup, in addition to finishing second to Czech in the 400 IM, took bronze in the 500 freestyle. Senior Joanna Bubeck and sophomore Erin Smith, defending champions in the 1,650 free and 100 backstroke, placed second in their respective events. Smith, who swam her fastest time of the season, missed first place by only a hundredth of a second.

The Bonnies also put together three topthree finishes in the relay events. The 800 free relay squad placed second while the 200 and 400 medley relay teams placed third.

Junior diver Katie O'Connell placed second in both the one- and three-meter competitions, the highest finishes of her career. Juniors Kelly McDaniels and Kara Daly also posted career-best finishes. McDaniels placed sixth in the one-meter while Daly made the finals in both events.

Though the Bonnies lost four seniors in May, the future of the program seems strong. Seven juniors will lead the program next season, and Bona hopes to add several strong incoming swimmers to the roster this spring.

"Recruiting is obviously the key," said Brennan. "The recruits we've brought in so far have been excellent, and if we can get even half of them to sign we'll be in great shape for next season."






Tina believes that with every giving, there is a receiving of sorts and this program is truly an example of this. There are 150 matches in the program and it continues to grow each year.












The President And His Cabinet
